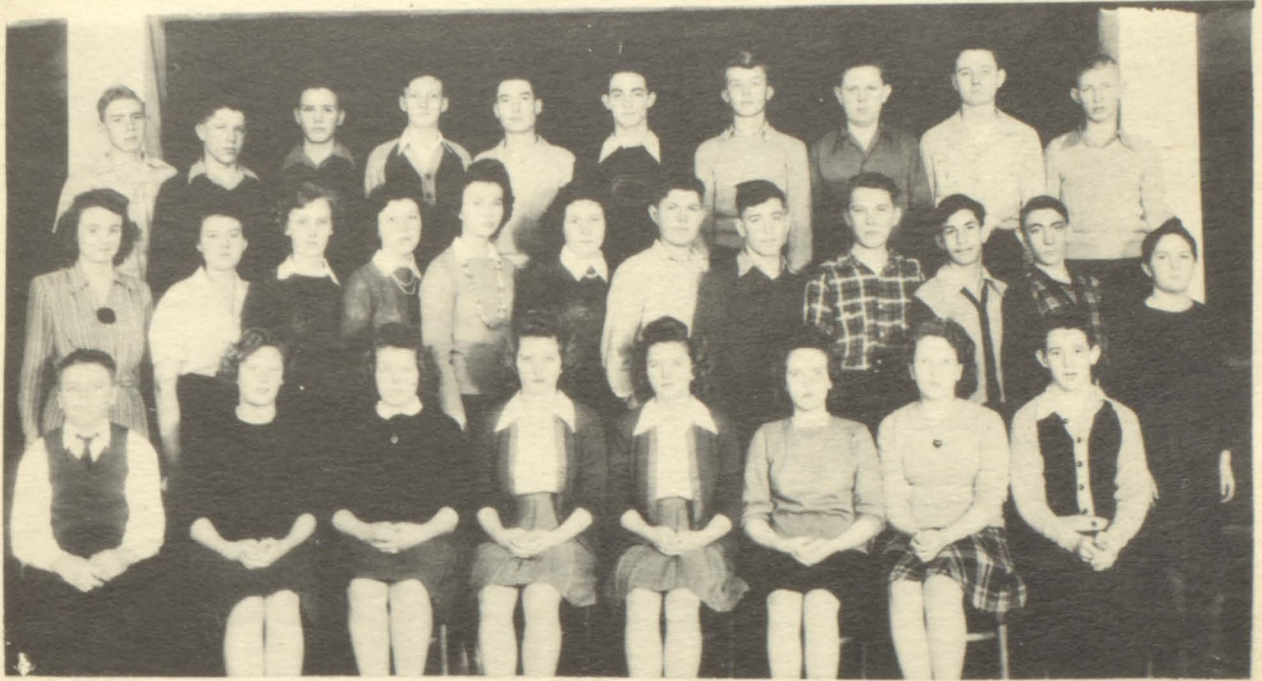

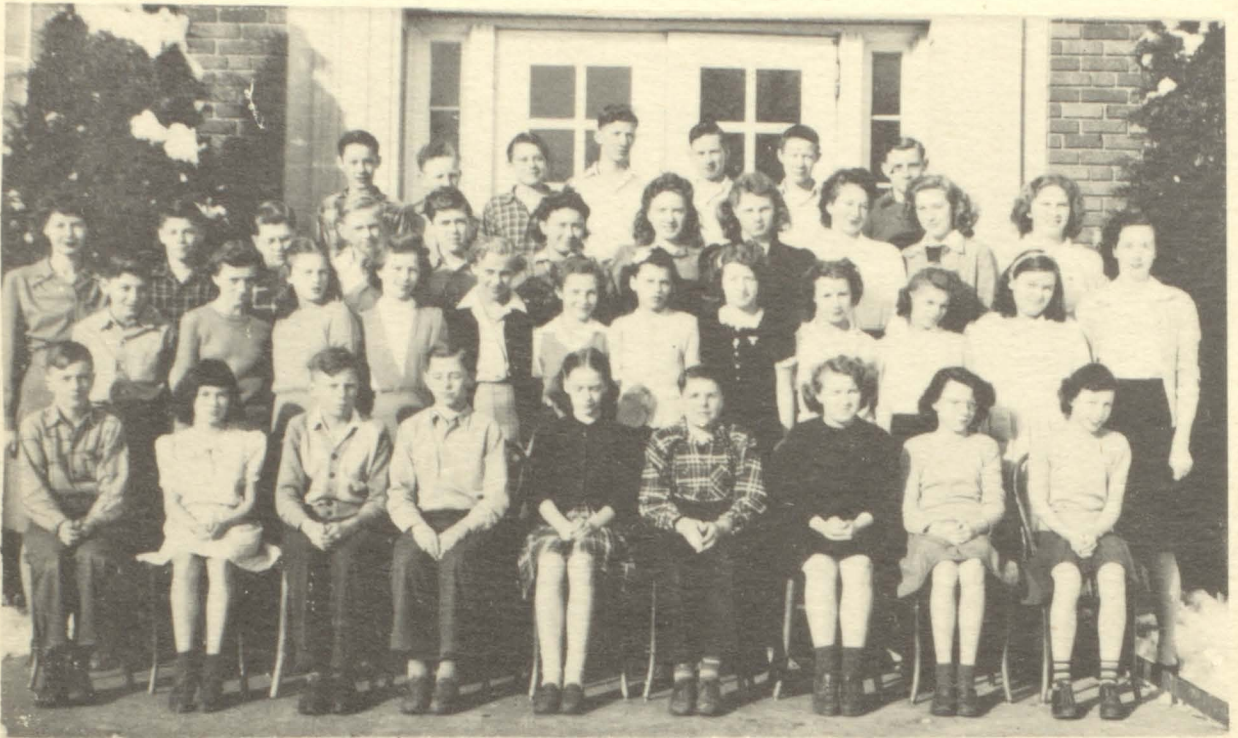
### FRESHMEN CLASS

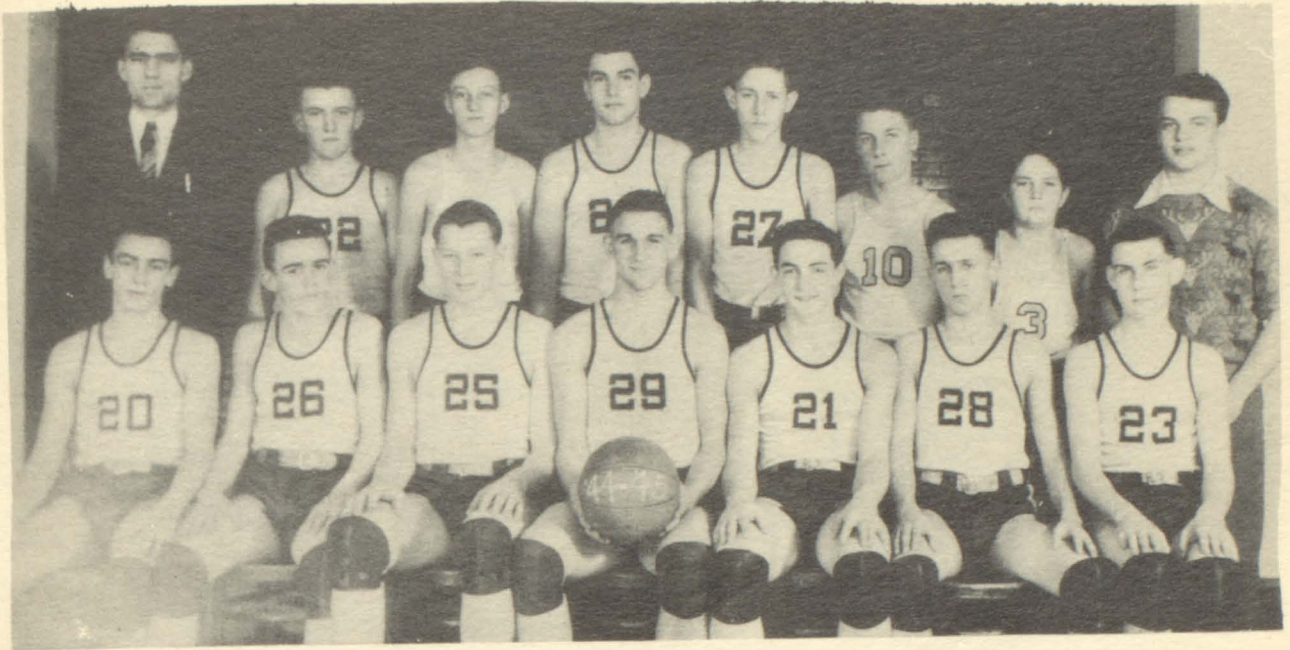
## SENIOR CLASS PLAY
