REPORTING BACK THIS SEASON WERE ONLY TWO LETTERMEN, HILL AND LEMKE. OTHERS REPORTING WERE: JIM RECKOFF, GLEN WAGGONER, DONNIE ELSBURY, WENDELL MILLER, JAMES NEGUS, GORDON WARREN, BOB WATSON, ED CHESLEY, JOHN FLACK, DALE MASON, RUSSELL GERRARD, GLEN HAKEMAN, JIM JENSEN, GORDON MILES, AND CLIFFORD SCHUEDER.

THE S.H.S. RUBISMEN WERE DEFEATED IN THEIR FIRST GAME OF THE SEASON BY A TALL AND LANKY MARATHON "FIVE" 38 TO 17.

THE TIGERS WALKED OFF WITH THEIR FIRST VICTORY OF THE SEASON WHEN THEY DEFEATED THE CLEGHORN QUINTET 36 TO 18.

A STRONG MILFORD TEAM SUBDUED THE TIGERS IN THE THIRD GAME OF THE SEASON BY A SCORE OF 37 TO 19. THE LOCAL "FIVE" WERE CRIPPLED CONSIDERABLY BY THE ABSENCE OF NED HILL.

OUR OLD RIVAL CALUMET CARRIED HOME A VICTORY WHEN, AFTER TWO OVERTIMES, THEY DEFEATED S.H.S. 25 TO 23.

THE S.H.S. "FIVE" WERE BEATEN BY ALTA ON THEIR OPPONENTS! FLOOR BY A SCORE OF 37 TO 21.

THE TIGERS WERE DEFEATED ON THE PRIMGHAR FLOOR WITH A SCORE OF 44 TO 16.

THE RUBISMEN SCORED A ONE-POINT VICTORY OVER SIOUX RAPIDS IN A FAST MOVING GAME ENDING WITH THE SCORE 32 TO 31.

THIS GAME SEEMED TO BE ONE OF THOSE BAD TIMES FOR S.H.S. WHEN THEY WERE DEFEATED BY HARTLEY WITH A SCORE OF 36 TO 16.

IN A THRILLER-DILLER GAME THE SUTHERLAND TEAM DEFEATED THEIR OPPONENT, SANBORN, 37 TO 35. THE SCORE WAS TIED, BUT JUST AS THE BUZZER SOUNDED, THE TIGERS MADE A BASKET GIVING US THE VICTORY.

IN THE COUNTY TOURNAMENT SUTHERLAND LOST TO HARTLEY 43 TO 38. DURING THE LAST HALF THE TIGERS MADE GOOD USE OF THE BALL BUT WERE UNABLE TO CATCH UP.

THE ARCHER "FIVE" TRIUMPHED IN A CLOSE GAME ON THE HOME FLOOR WITH A FINAL SCORE OF 26 TO 24.

DETERMINED TO WIN, THE TIGERS DEFEATED AURELIA (THE 1943-1944 CHEROKEE COUNTY CHAMPS) OUTSCORING THEM 26 TO 24.
