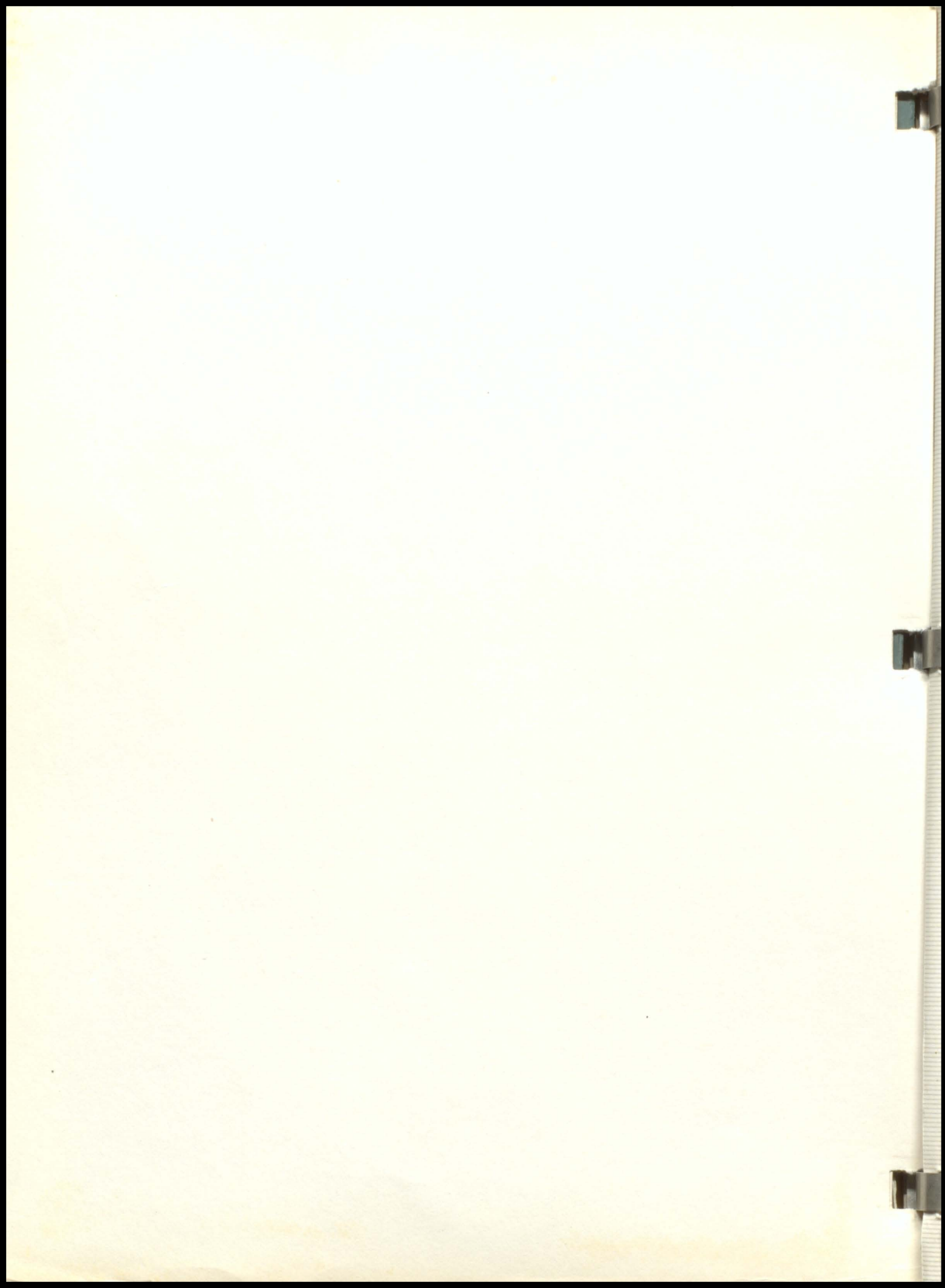












## DEDICATION

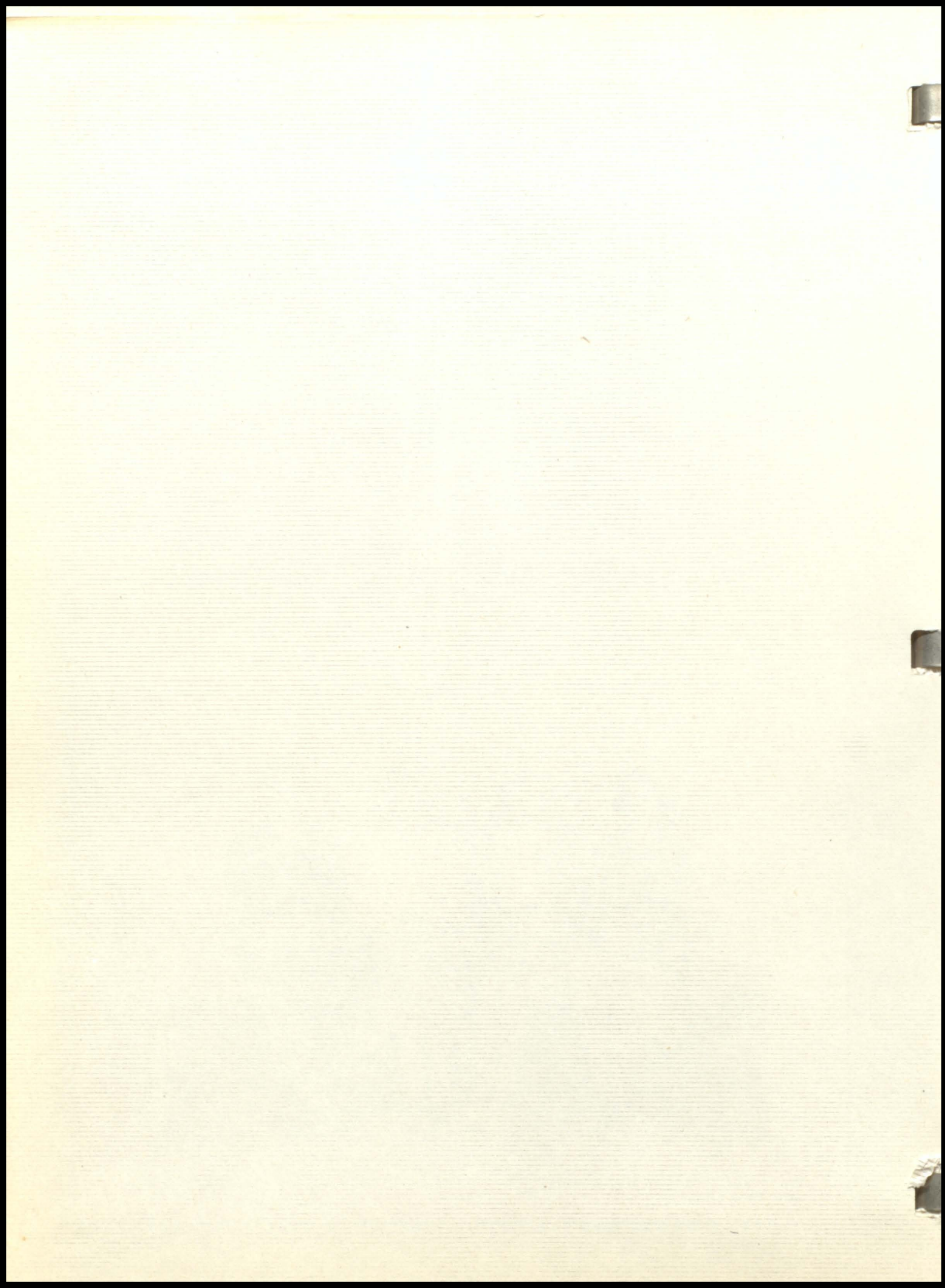

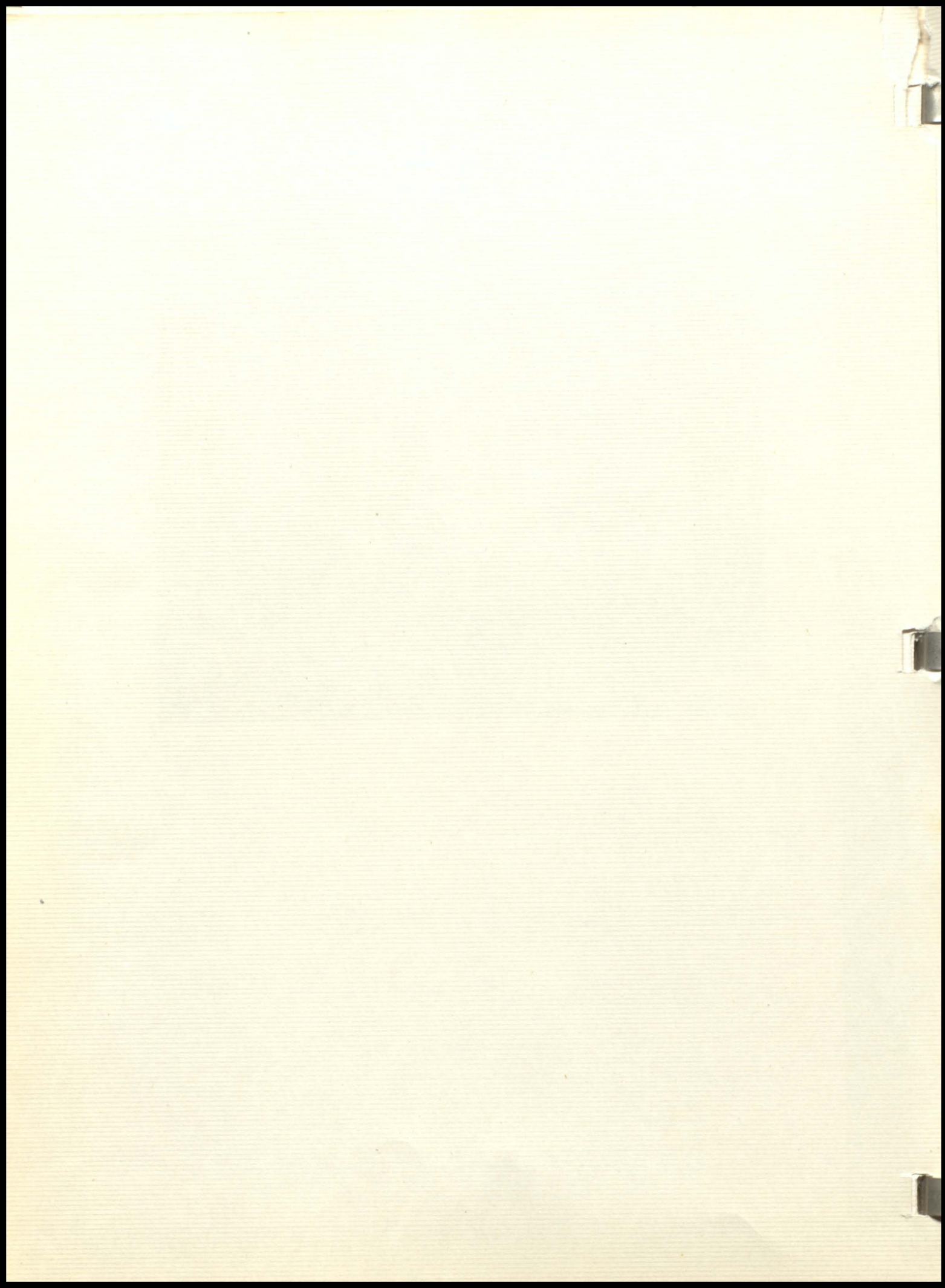
"ALL AMERICAN FAMILY"
