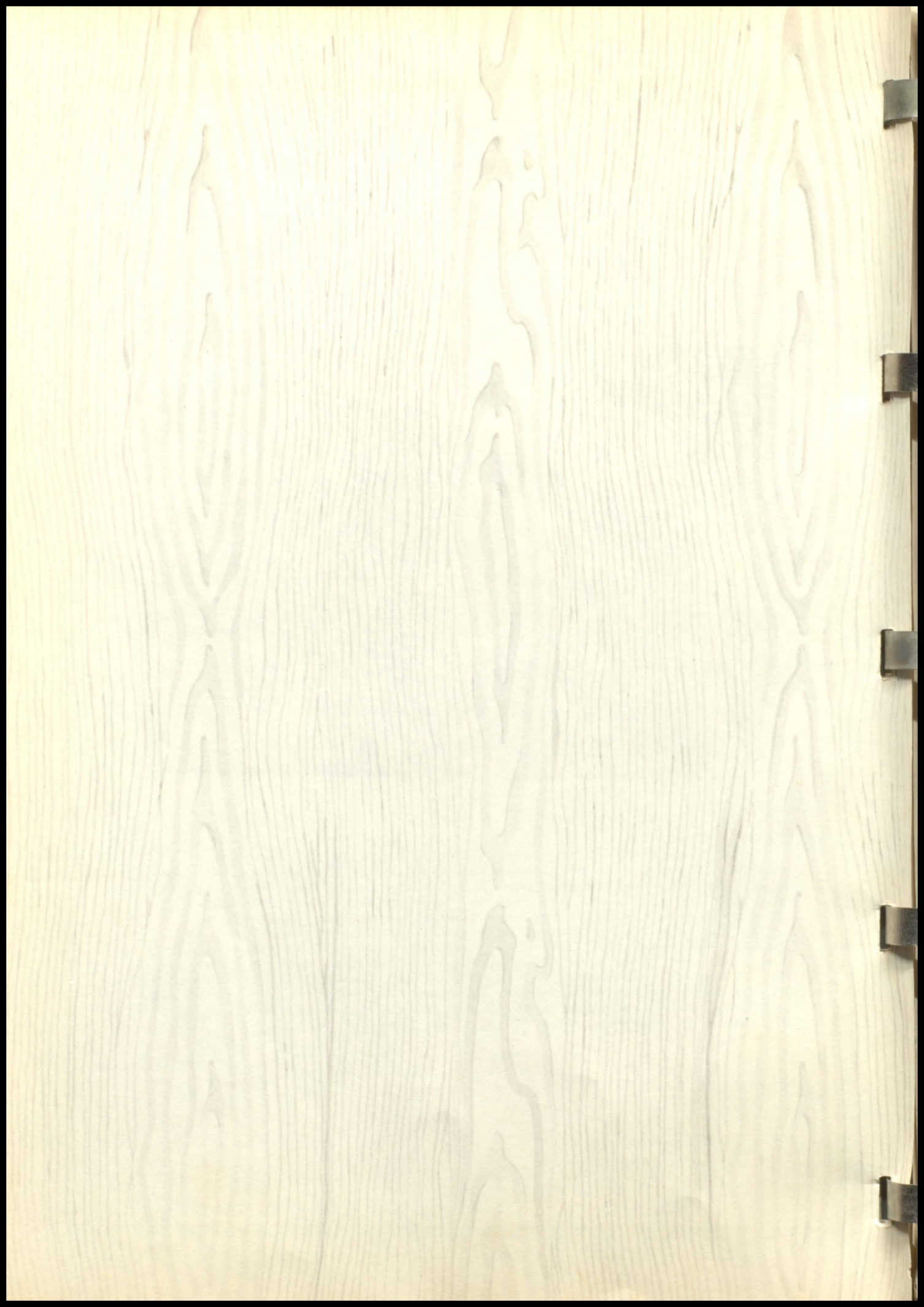


ADMINISTRATION

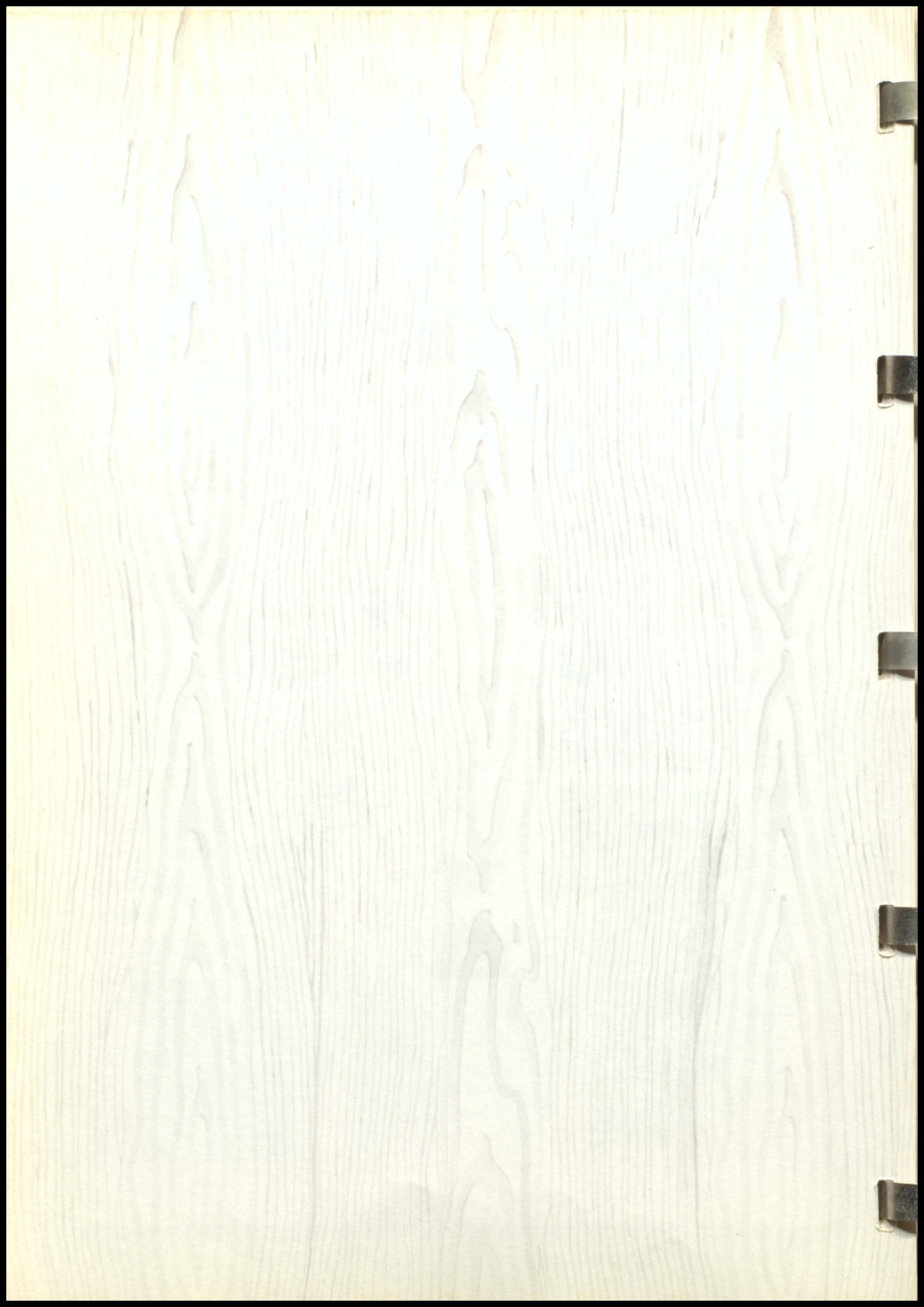
Tiger Basketball Play Royal Friday; Lose In Tournament

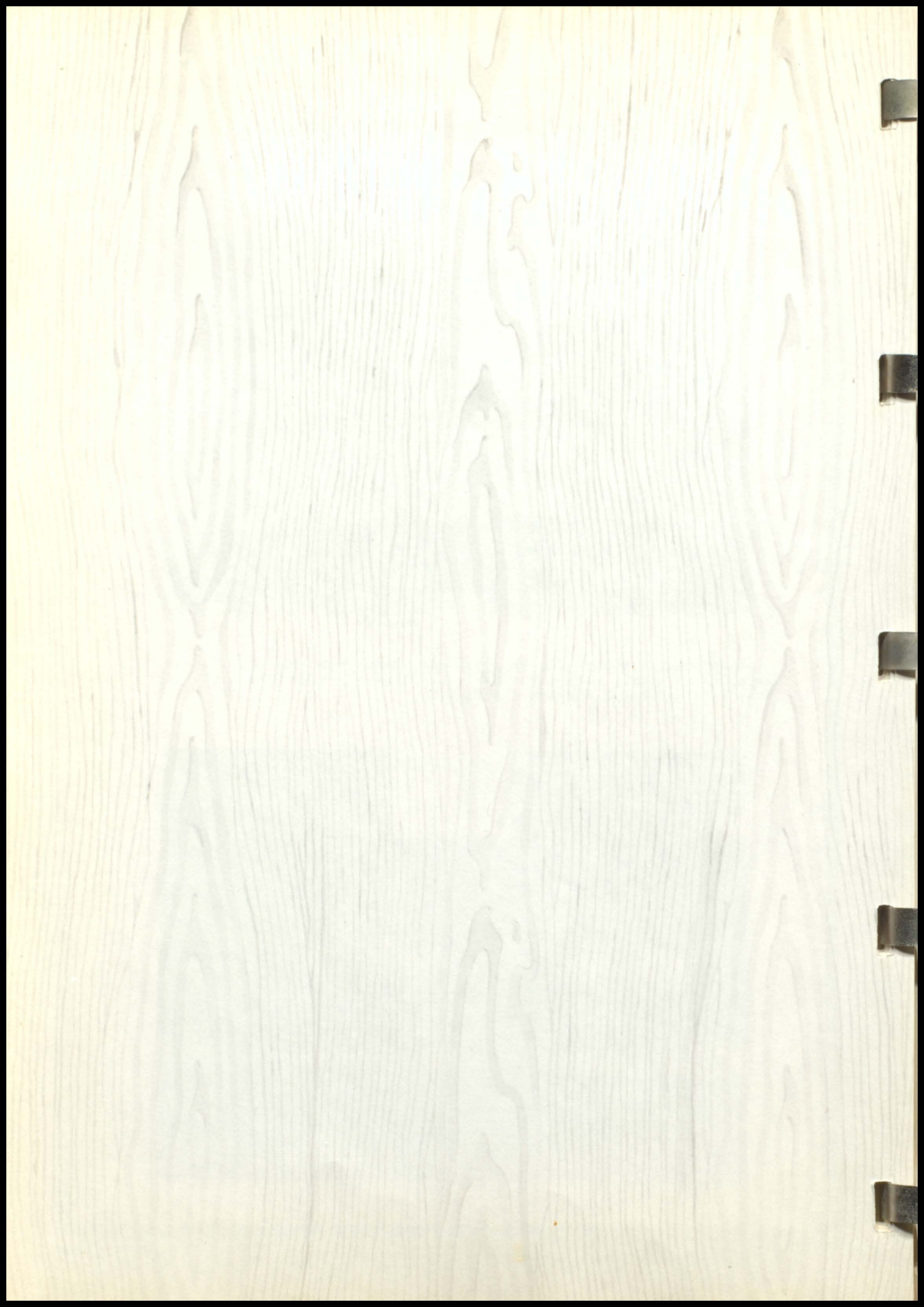

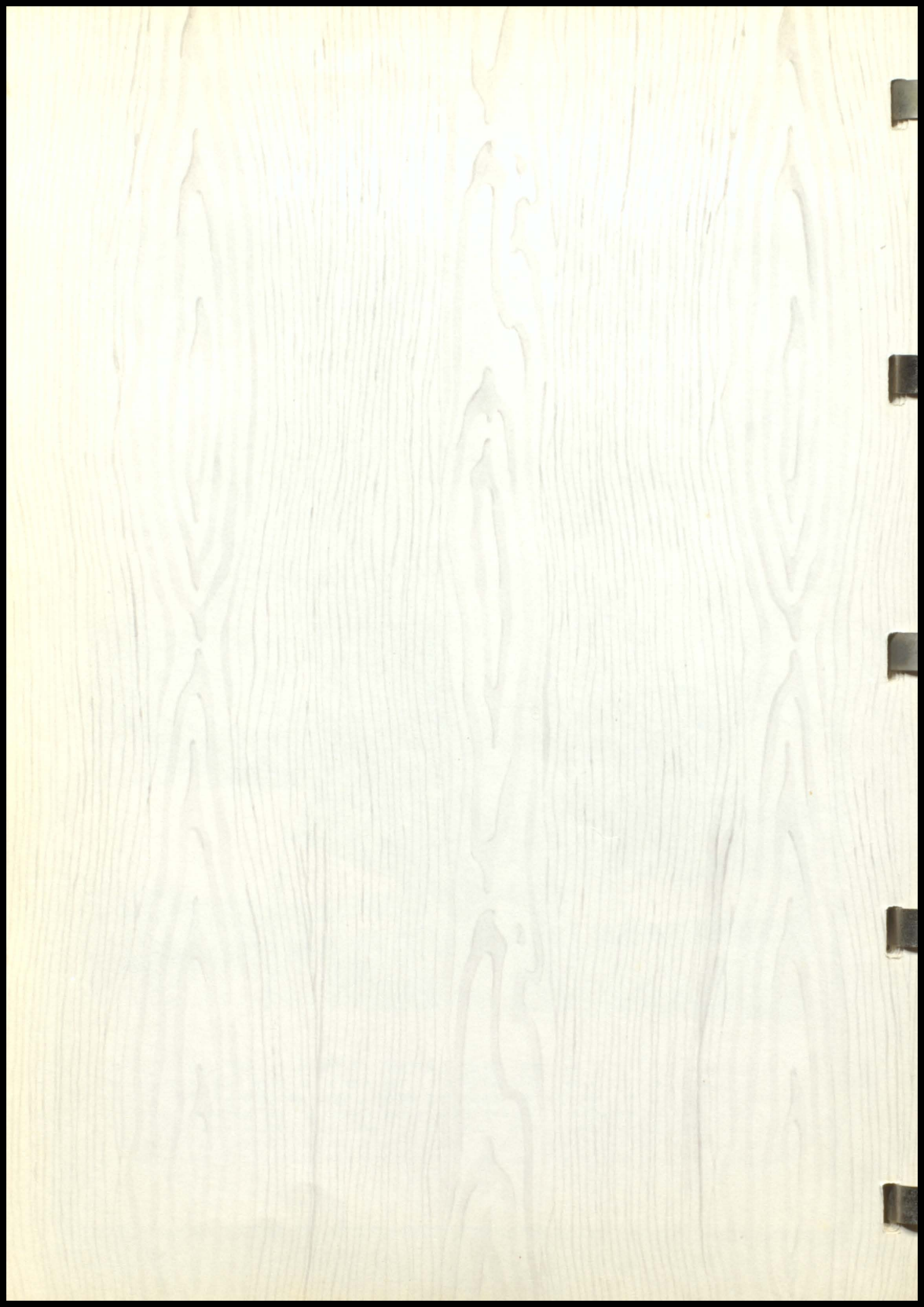

NOVEMBER 10, 1949, WAS THE 101ST BIRTHDAY OF "GRANDPA JIM" MARTIN. HE IS THE ONLY REMAINING CIVIL WAR VETERAN IN THE STATE OF IOWA AND IS THE COMMANDER OF THE G.A.R. ON HIS BIRTHDAY THE SCHOOL BAND MARCHED AND THE SMALLER GRADES CARRIED BANNERS. FOR VARIOUS REASONS THROUGHOUR OUR JOURNEY SOME OF THE STUDENTS STOPPED IN ONE GRADE MORE THAN A YEAR WHILE OTHERS MOVED AWAY. WE DISCOVERED THIS COMPOSED THE FIRST GRADE. THERE WAS A SLIGHT CHANGE IN THE CAST, HOWEVER. WE NOTICED THE FOLLOWING FACES MISSING: KENNETH JORDON, JOYCE COOPER, JOY SALZKORN, AND RITA SCHALLAU. THERE ARE SOME NEW FACES IN THE GROUP, HOWEVER. WE RECOGNIZE THESE NEWCOMERS AS: MARCELLA LOHBERGER, CHARLES BRANSTETTER, DAVID DAVIS AND CLARE TRIPLETT. IN THE BACKGROUND WE SEE DORIS JENSEN DIRECTING THIS GROUP. JUST AS THE SCREEN FADES WE CATCH A GLIMPSE OF THE ENTIRE CAST WITH A CASE OF MEASLES ALIAS MERCUROCHROME WHICH RESULTS IN A THOROUGH SCURBBING AND NO RECESS.

AS THE NEXT SCENE OPENS THE SECOND GRADE COMES INTO FOCUS. WE FIND RUTH WEALE DIRECTING THE CAST. THE CAST HAS LOST DAVID DAVIS AND ELAINE ROHRS BUT THE PERSONEL AS BEEN INCREASED BY BETTY SPEERS, ROBERT PETERSON, AND DENNIS JOINES.

AGAIN THE SCREEN HAS CHANGED. A LIKENESS OF THE THIRD GRADE COMES INTO OUR LINE OF VISION. WE SEE FLORENCE PETERSON IN CHARGE OF THE CAST. THE MISSING FACES OF THIS GRADE ARE: ROBERT PETERSON AND WILLIAM RAHBUSCH. ASIDE FROM THIS THE CAST WAS UNCHANGED. FURTHER PRODUCTION FOR ONE DAY WAS HALTED BY THE MISTAKEN IDENTITY OF EX-LAX FOR THE FAVORITE HERSHEY BAR. THE POST OFFICE SEEMED QUITE GENEROUS TO US THAT DAY IN THE ISSUING OF FREE CANDY.

WE LEAVE THIS GROUP WITH THEIR TROUBLES AND PASS ON TO THE NEXT SCENE. WE SEE ESTHER WOOD FINDING TROUBLE WITH THE LITTLE MATHEMATICIANS IN OUR CAST. THE NEW ENTRANTS TO OUR CAST INCLUDE: ROBERT BLAUE, MERLE BROWN, EVELYN TRIPLETT, AND JANE KELGORE. THE ONE WHO SEEMS TO HAVE LEFT THIS GROUP IS BETTY SPEERS.

WE HAVE NO DIFFICULTY IN RECOGNIZING THE NEXT GROUP OF FACES, FOR WE SEE MISS LYNCH WITH HER CLASS DRINKING THEIR DAILY PINT OF MILK. PEEPING OVER THE TOPS OF THE MILK BOTTLES, WE SEE THE EYES OF THE FOLLOWING NEW MEMBERS OF THE CAST: BONNIE BREECHER, PHYLLIS DOHNKE, MARILYN LAUE, JOY SALZKORN, INEZ SMITH, SHERIDAN BLAUE, BURDETTE BREECHER AND JAMES JONES. WE LOST NONE OF OUR CAST. WE FIND SEVERAL MEMBERS OF THE CAST SUSPENDED FROM REST PERIODS FOR A WEEK FOR PLAYING THE RUGGED GAME OF FOOTBALL WITH A FELLOW MEMBER'S STOCKING CAP.



THE FILM REPRESENTS A NEW ERA IN THE LIVES OF THESE STRUGGLING SIX GRADERS AS THEY MADE THEIR DEBUTE INTO THE JUNIOR HIGH. IT TOOK MORE THAN ONE DIRECTOR TO HELP PRODUCE THIS ERA OF THE FILM. THEY WERE MAURENE TIOSSEM, PRINCIPAL, RUTH JOHNSON AND JEAN LAUDERDALE. CLIFFORD LARSON, JACK SCHROEDER, BERNICE TROJAHN, JACK SCHRIVER AND BERNARD ELSBURY JOINED THE CAST. THE ONLY ONE NOT TO CONTINUE WITH US WAS JANE KILGORE WHO MOVED AWAY.

ADVANCING INTO THE SEVENTH GRADE WE ARE GOVERNED BY RUTH JOHNSON, JEAN LAUDERDALE AND MARGARET SCHULLER. A FEW NEW FACES APPEAR: GALA FREEMAN, BETTY GINGER, RITA ROWHER AND MARY SCHLICHTING. THOSE MISSING ARE: JACK SCHROEDER, KEITH OLHAUSEN AND JAMES JONES.

AS WE ENTER THE FINAL STAGE OF THIS PROGRESS ERA, WE FIND THE DIRECTING PERSONAL SLIGHTLY CHANGED. THEY ARE MARGARET CHRISTENSON, BARBARA WARE AND MARGARET SCHULLER. A SERGE OF ROMATICISM HAS TOUCHED THE CLASS FOR THE BOYS HAVE DELEGATED THEIR SPARE TIME TO NOTE WRITING AND THE GIRLS RESPONDED WITH EYE WINKING. THOSE THAT JOINED THE GRADUATING CLASS WERE DICK RECKOFF, BETTY MASON AND KEITH OLHAUSEN. NO ONE WAS LOST.

WITH AN ARMFUL OF BOOKS AND MEEK LOOKS ON THEIR FACES WE RECOGNIZED THE FOLLOWING: ROBERT CARNAHAN, LELAND DAVIS, JAMES DRAKE, BERNARD ELSBURY, BONNIE ELSBURY, BILL ENGELKE, MARION FOGLEMAN, KATHRYN GERRARD, CLIFFORD LARSON, MARCELLA LOHBERGER, BETTY MASON, KEITH OLHAUSEN, BETTY PEKELDER, MARGA RAHBUSCH, DICK RECKOFF, RITA ROHWER, JOY SALZKORN, MARY SCHLICHTING, DAVE SCHRIENER, DOROTHY SELK, JACK SCHRIVER, KENNETH STEUCK, LORRAINE STEUCK, RUSSELL TIOSSEM, CLARE TRIPLETT, EVELYN TRIPLETT, JACK TRIPLETT, JACQUELYN TRIPLETT, AND DELBERT WOHLERT. THE DIRECTING STAFF AT THIS TIME CONSISTED OF MISS SCHALLAU, MISS HUSTON, MRS. REESE, MISS PATTERSON, MR. BAIRD AND MR. RUBIS. THOSE MISSING WERE INEZ SMITH AND GALA FREEMAN WHO TRANSFERRED TO BE MEMBERS OF ANOTHER CAST.

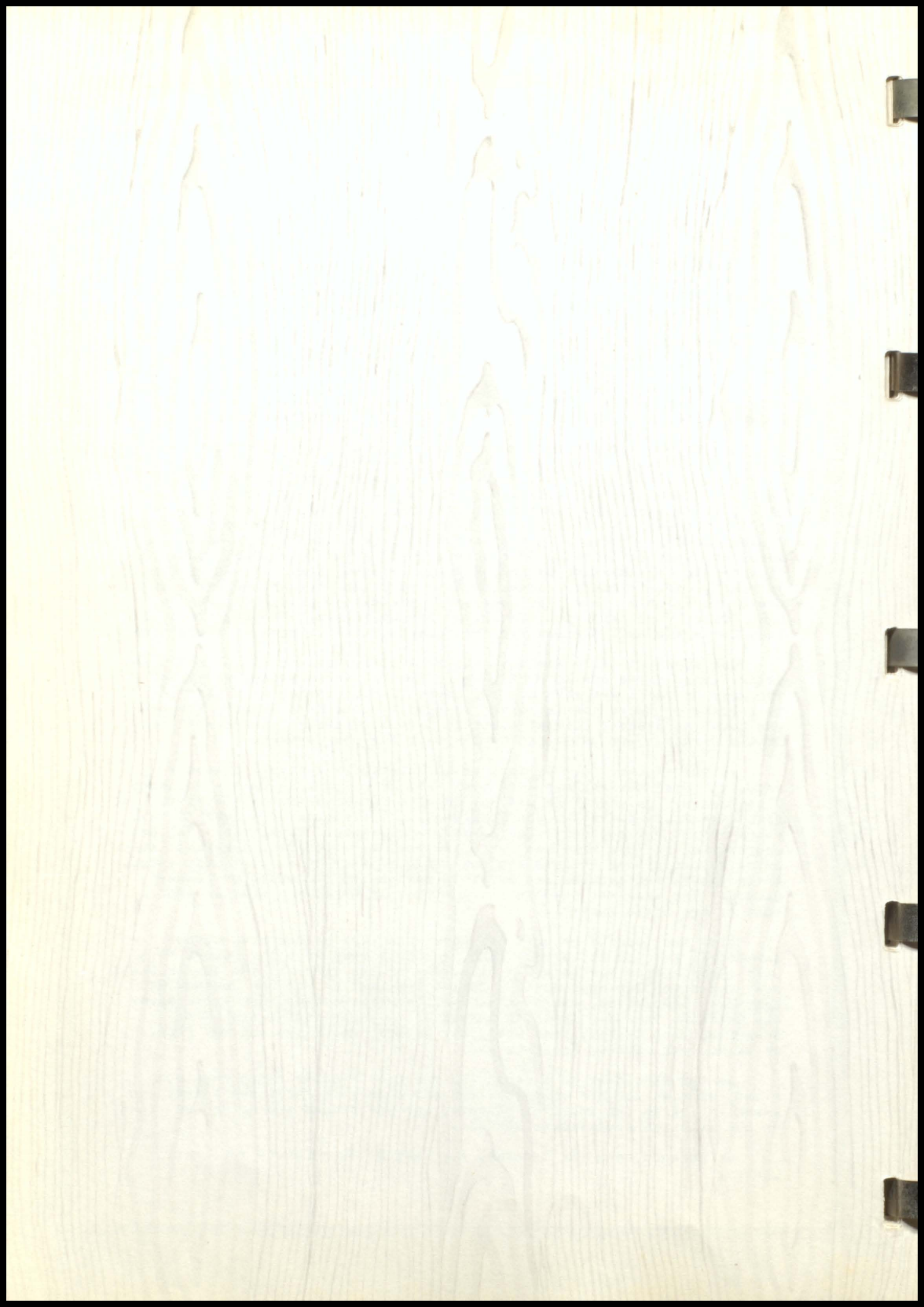
OUR SOPHOMORE YEAR WAS GOVERNED BY A SLIGHT CHANGE IN THE DIRECTING STAFF. MRS. BAIRD REPLACED MR. RUBIS, AND MR. ADAMS BECAME PRINCIPAL. THE REST OF THE STAFF REMAINED THE SAME. THOSE OMITTED FROM CAST OF THIS CLASS OF THEIR SOPHISTICATED SOPHOMORES WERE RITA ROHWER, KENNETH AND LORRAINE STEUCK, DELBERT WOHLERT, DAVE SCHRIENER, DICK RECHOFF AND DENNIS JOINES. THE ONE ADDED TO OUR CAST WAS DON JOHNSON.

IN THE FALL OF 1947 WE WERE AGAIN GREETED BY A SLIGHT CHANGE IN FACULTY. MISS WONSMAS REPLACED MISS PATTERSON AND MISS CHITTY REPLACED MISS HUSTON. JOINING THEM WAS MR. BROWER. JOINING THE CAST AT THIS TIME WERE ANNA BELLA SMITH AND DON MCKEIGHAN. THE FOLLOWING SEEMED TO HAVE FADED OUT OF THE PICTURE: DON JOHNSON AND MARCELLA LOHBERGER. THE BIG UNDERTAKING OF THIS YEAR WAS OUR CLASS PLAY ENTITLED "ALL AMERICAN FAMILY" WHICH PROVED A HUGE SUCCESS AND OUR BANQUET BASED ON A NIGHT CLUB THEME. AFTER DINNER THE EVENING WAS SPENT IN DANCING TO THE MUSIC OF JOHNNY GALVIN. THE YEAR WAS CLIMAXED BY A PICNIC AT CHEROKEE WHERE WE MADE A TOUR OF THE STATE HOSPITAL.

WITH THE THOUGHT OF JUST ONE MORE YEAR LEFT OF OUR HIGH SCHOOL CARREER WE ENTERED AUGUST 30, 1948, IN ORDER THAT WE MIGHT REMOVE THIS LAST BARREER FROM OUR PATH. A HIGHLIGHT OF THE YEAR WAS THE SENIOR CLASS PLAY ENTITLED "OLD HOME TOWN." DURING THE LAST LAY OF OUR JOURNEY WE LOST MARY SCHLICHTING, MARION FOGLEMAN, KATHRYN GERRARD, BERNARD ELSBURY AND CLIFFORD LARSON. THOSE IN CHARGE OF THIS LAST SCENE WERE MISS SCHALLAU, MISS CHITTY, MISS MOSS, MR. BROWER, MR. BAIRD AND MR. BEUHLER. WE GAINED ONE MEMBER, FLORENCE DAU.

AS THE REEL CAME TO A CLOSE AND THE LAST PICTURE FADED FROM OUR SIGHT, WE REALIZED OUR OPPORTUNITIES AND WISH TO EXPRESS OUR THANKS AND APPRECIATION TO THE FACULTY, PARENTS, AND ANY OTHERS WHO HELPED US ALONG ON OUR TIRELESS EDUCATIONAL JOURNEY.

WE EMERGED FROM THE THEATRE, ALL AGREED "THUS ENDETH THE FIRST LESSON."
