TIGER'S 1950 FOOTBALL SEASON

NINETEEN REPORTED FOR THE FIRST PRACTICE OF THE 1950 GRID SEASON. THEY WERE AS FOLLOWS: LETTERMEN: BERNARD PETERSEN—TRANSFER FROM KINGSLEY WHERE HE WAS ACTIVE IN SPORTS—AND JIM HULSER, SENIORS; CHARLES YOUDE, AND DICK SUMP; JUNIORS; DICK BRECHWALD AND PAUL GEUTHER SOPHOMORES.

OTHER GRID CANDIDATES INCLUDED RICHARD AND ROBERT MORRIS; SENIORS, CLARK KING, RICHARD SHRIVER, WESLEY YATES; JUNIORS; LONNY WEDE AND PAUL WITTROCK; SOPHOMORES; AND DONALD CASE, KENNETH HECKERT, RICHARD HILL, CHARLES MILLER, JERRY JONES, AND KENNETH PETERSEN: FRESHMEN

THE TIGERS OPENED THEIR GRID SEASON AT PETERSON ON SEPTEMBER 15, IN A NON-CONFERENCE GAME. BOTH TEAMS SHOWED SOME FIRST CONTEST WEAKNESSES IN BOTH OFFENSIVE AND DEFENSIVE PLAYS. THE TIGERS THREATENED THE PETERSON GOAL ONLY ONCE DURING THE GAME, WHILE THE PETERSON WAHAWKS WERE WITHIN STRIKING DISTANCE THREE TIMES DURING THE CONTEST. THE GAME FINALLY ENDED IN A SCORELESS TIE. JIM HULSER, SENIOR LINEMAN AND PAUL GEUTHER, SOPHOMORE BACK, PLAYED GOOD BALL FOR THE LOCALS. MUELLER AND NELSON WERE RESPONSIBLE FOR GOOD PLAYS FOR PETERSON.

IN THE TIGERS FIRST SIOUX VALLEY CONFERENCE TILT OF THE 1950 SEASON AT PAULLINA THE PANTHERS RAN THE OPENING KICK OFF BACK 90 YARDS FOR THE FIRST SCORE OF THE GAME. THEN, SHORTLY AFTER, THEY SCORED AGAIN ON A LONG DRIVE DOWNFIELD. THE SCORE REMAINED AT 13-0 FOR THE FOLLOWING THREE QUARTERS, WITH BOTH TEAMS SHOWING EXCELLENT BLOCKING AND TACKLING, BUT NEITHER TEAM BEING ABLE TO SCORE.

THE TIGERS DROPPED THEIR SECOND SIOUX VALLEY CONFERENCE GAME TO AURELIA BY THE SCORE OF 27-0. THE WINNERS WERE LEADING 13-0 AT HALFTIME. THE TIGERS, SLOW IN THE OFFENSIVE DRIVES, WERE UNABLE TO BREAK THE STRONG AURELIA DEFENSE, WHO MAKE MOST OF THEIR GAINS BY AERIAL PLAYS. THE TIGER SQUAD WAS SPARKED BY RICH SHRIVER AND PAUL GEUTHER, BACKS, AND JIM HULSER IN THE LINE.

OCTOBER 13, SAW THE LOCALS BLANKED BY THE PRIMGHAR BULLDOGS, WHEN THEY RAN WILD THROUGH THE TIGER DEFENSES TO ROLL UP A 46 TO 0 SCORE. THE LOCALS WERE UNABLE TO STOP THE HARD HITTING, SHIFTY PLAYS OF THE, BULLDOGS. STEFFENS AND HENLINE OF PRIMGHAR HAD A FIELD DAY IN OPEN-FIELD RUNNING.

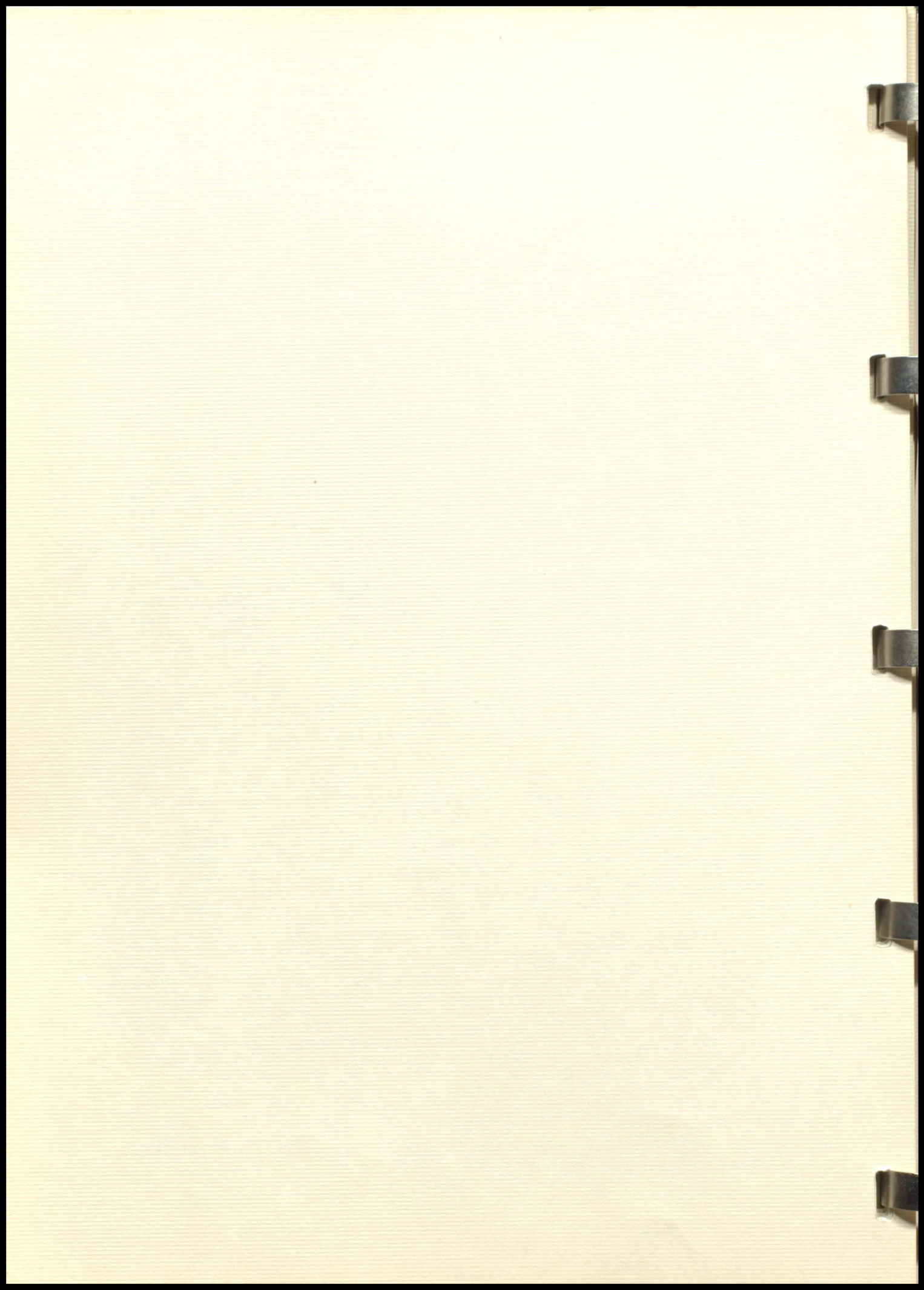
THE SUTHERLAND TIGERS WERE SEVERELY TROUNCED AT HARTLEY, WHEN THEY WERE STEAMROLLED 59-0. THE LOCALS WERE UNABLE TO MAKE THEIR OFFENSE CLICK EITHER ON THE GROUND OR IN THE AIR.

HIGHLIGHT OF THE HOMECOMING FESTIVITIES WAS THE 13-6 VICTORY BY THE SUTHERLAND TIGERS OVER MILFORD. THE TIGERS PLAYED THE BEST GAME THEY HAD PLAYED ALL SEASON. THE TIGERS GAINED THEIR FIRST COUNTER IN THE FIRST QUARTER WHEN GEUTHER WENT OVER ON A SHORT BURST THROUGH THE LINE. THE SECOND COUNTER WAS ALSO MADE BY GEUTHER IN THE FINAL PERIOD.

THE LAST GAME OF THE SEASON WAS PLAYED WITH ALTA AT SUTHERLAND, ON NOVEMBER 1. IT WAS A WELL PLAYED CONTEST WITH ALTA COMING OUT ON TOP BY THE SCORE OF 35-20. THE SCORE AT THE HALF WAS ALTA 21, SUTHERLAND 6. ALTA SCORED TWICE MORE IN THE THIRD QUARTER BEFORE SUTHERLAND COULD GET THE BALL ROLLING. AT THE BEGINNING OF THE FOURTH QUARTER BRECKWALD SCORED ON A SLEEPER PASS FROM GEUTHER, WITH PETERSEN MAKING THE CONVERSION TO MAKE THE SCORE 35-13. ALTA THEN TOOK OVER THE BALL BUT LOST IT ON DOWNS. SUTHERLAND PASSED FOR A FIRST DOWN AND THEN GEUTHER PASSED TO PETERSEN FOR A TOUCHDOWN! IT WAS PETE'S FIRST TOUCHDOWN OF HIS CAREER. THE GAME ENDED BY THE SCORE OF 35-20

JIM HULSER WAS HONORED BY RECEIVING A FIRST PLACE BERTH ON THE SIOUX VALLEY ALL CONFERENCE TEAM.

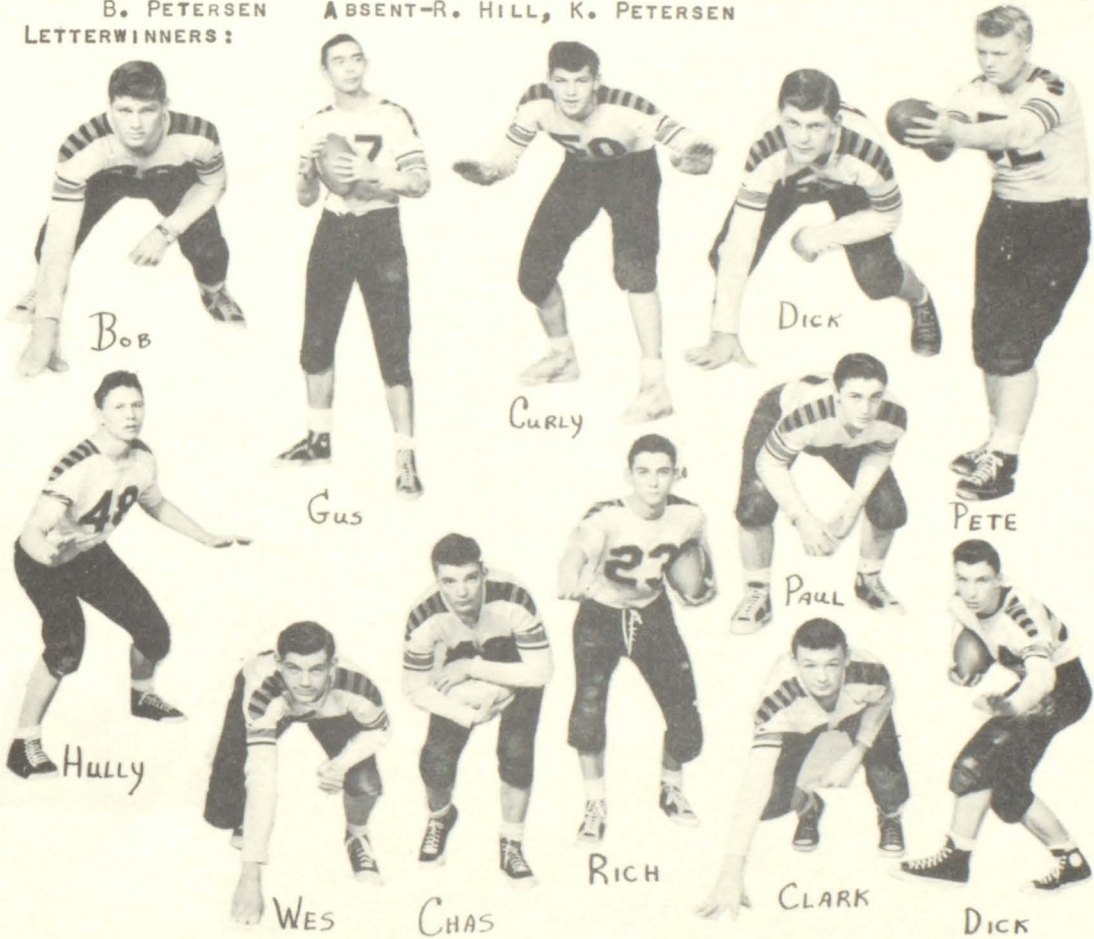

TIGER'S 1950-51 BASKETBALL SEASON

THE TIGERS STARTED THE 50-51 SEASON WITH 20 BOYS REPORTING FOR THE FIRST PRACTICE. JIM HULSER WAS THE ONLY LETTERMAN.

THE TIGERS DROPPED THEIR INITIAL CONTEST TO MARATHON BY THE VERY SLIGHT MARGIN OF 41-39. YOUDE WAS HIGH FOR THE LOCALS WITH 13 POINTS.

DECEMBER THE 15TH THE TIGERS JOURNEYED TO MILFORD TO WIN THEIR FIRST GAME OF THE SEASON EDGING THE PIONEERS 40-39 ON GEUTHER'S LAST FIVE SECONDS SHOT FROM THE CORNER. HULSER WAS HIGH FOR THE TIGERS WITH 12.

ON THE FOLLOWING TUESDAY CALUMET TROUNCED THE TIGERS 61-38. THE TIGERS GOT AWAY TO A SLOW START AND COULD NEVER OVERTAKE THE LEAD GAINED BY THE INDIANS IN THE INITIAL PERIOD. YOUDE LED SUTHERLAND WITH 12 POINTS.

SUTHERLAND STARTED OUT THE O'BRIEN COUNTY TOURNAMENT BY EDGING PRIMGHAR 31-29, IN A THRILLER THUS AVENGING A EARLIER DEFEAT BY THE BULLDOGS. HULSER HAD 10 POINTS FOR THE TIGERS.

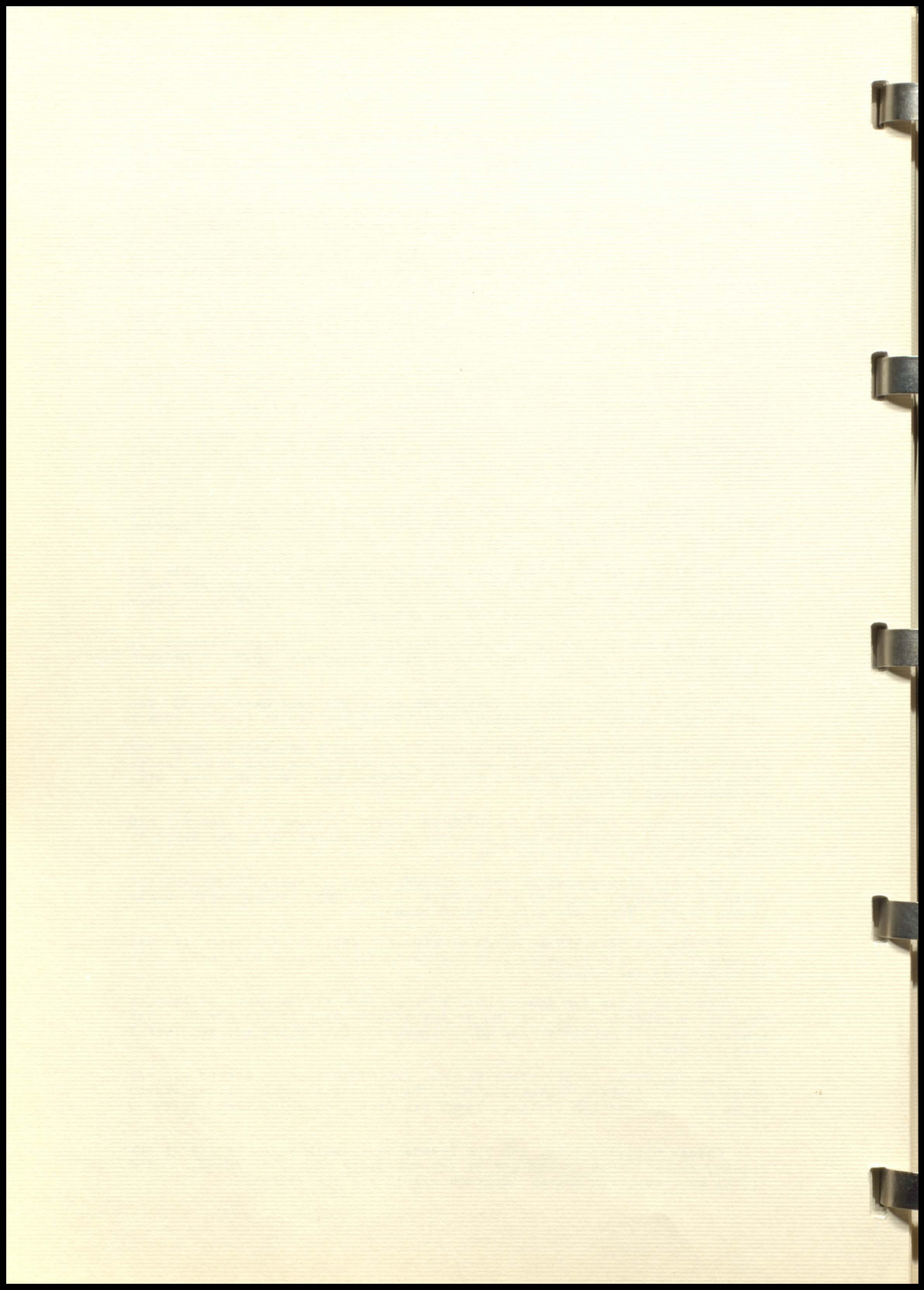

FRIDAY FEBRUARY 16TH, SAW THE TIGERS TAKE THEIR WORST DEFEAT OF THE SEASON, AT THE HANDS OF HARTLEY BY THE ONE SIDED SCORE OF 72-38. THE TIGERS WERE NEVER IN THERE. GEUTHER HAD 12 FOR THE TIGERS.



SUTHERLAND STARTED OFF THEIR SECTIONAL TOURNAMENT AT SANBORN WITH A BANG BY WHIPPING EXCELSIOR 53-42. EXCELSIOR LED AT THE HALF 21-20. YOUDE HAD 24 POINTS FOR THE TIGERS.

TIGER'S 1950 HOMECOMING

ON WEDNESDAY NIGHT, OCTOBER 25TH, AT 7:30, THE HOMECOMING FESTIVITIES WERE STARTED BY IGNITING THE TRADITIONAL BONFIRE. OUR ALUMNI SPEAKER, MR. JAMES TRIPPLETT, BROUGHT BACK THE MEMORIES OF YESTERDAYS FOOTBALL TEAMS. HE ALSO MENTIONED THE SCHOOL SPIRIT HE HAD WITNESSED THIS YEAR. IN CONCLUSION, AND SPEAKING FROM EXPERIENCE, HE SAID THAT YOU REALIZE HOW MUCH YOU LOVE THE GAME WHEN YOU CANNOT PLAY ANY LONGER. THE CANDIDATES FOR QUEEN—PATRICIA ORTHMANN, CLEO CHESLEY, AND MARILYN McCORMACK—WERE INTRODUCED. THE PEP MEETING WAS BROUGHT TO A CLOSE WITH A FEW YELLS AND SINGING THE SCHOOL SONG.

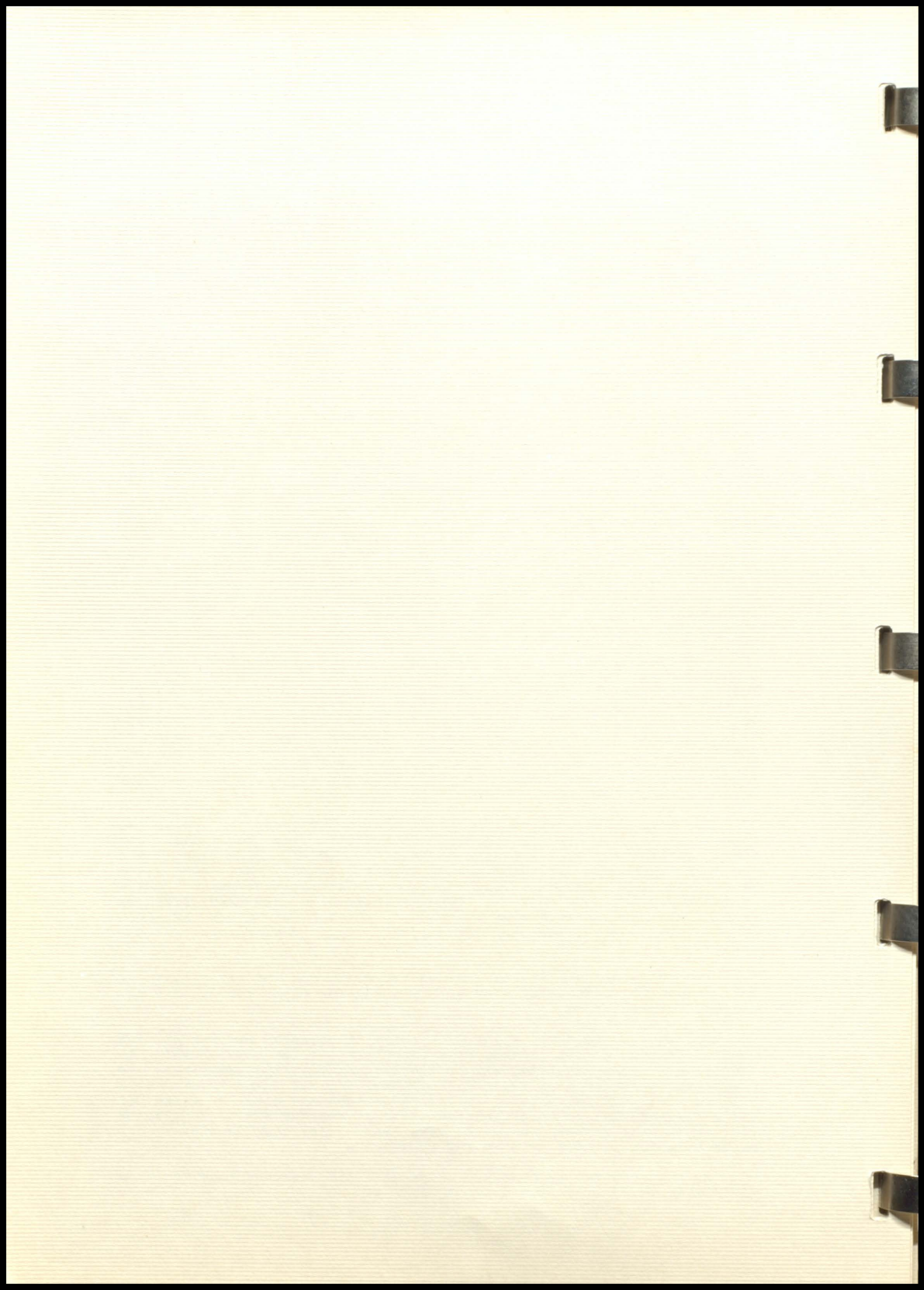
