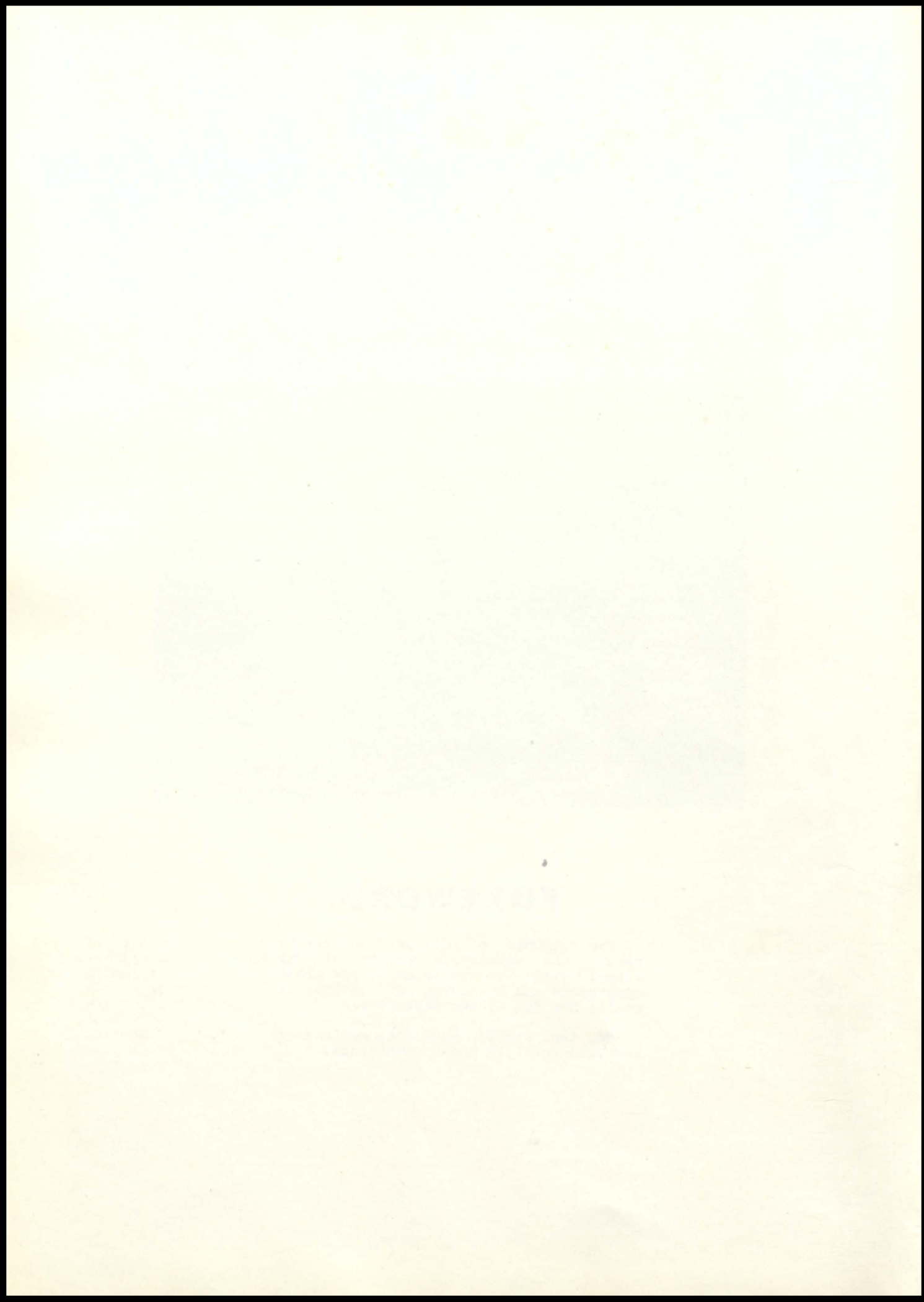


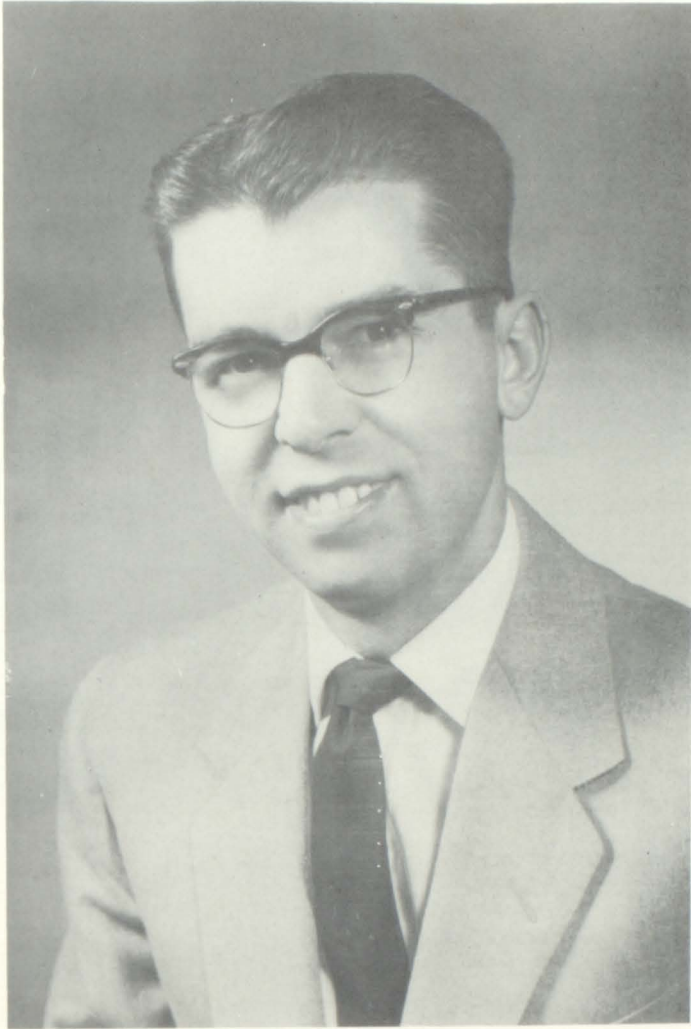


FOREWORD

We, the staff, hope this edition of the Duke fulfills these conditions.

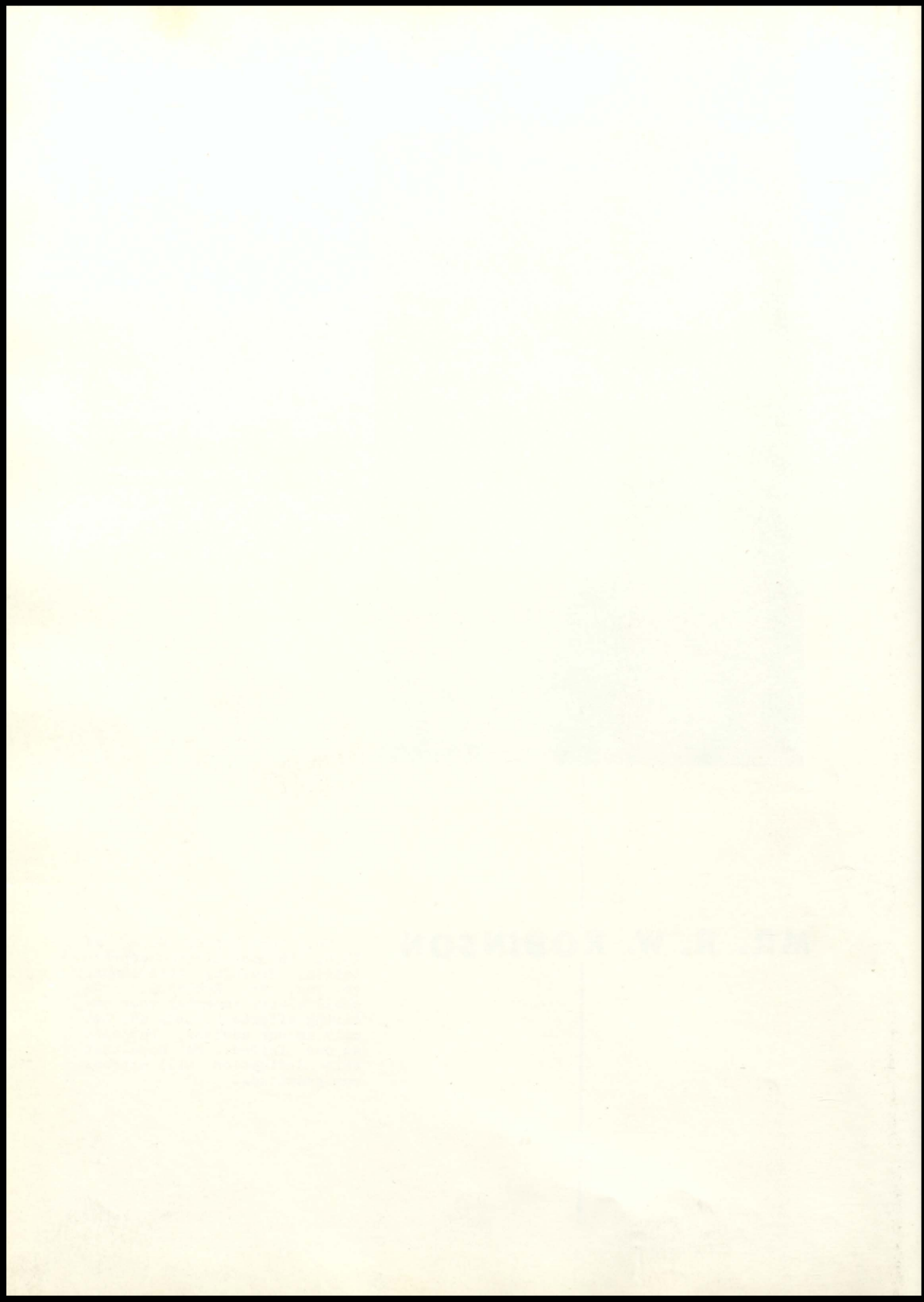

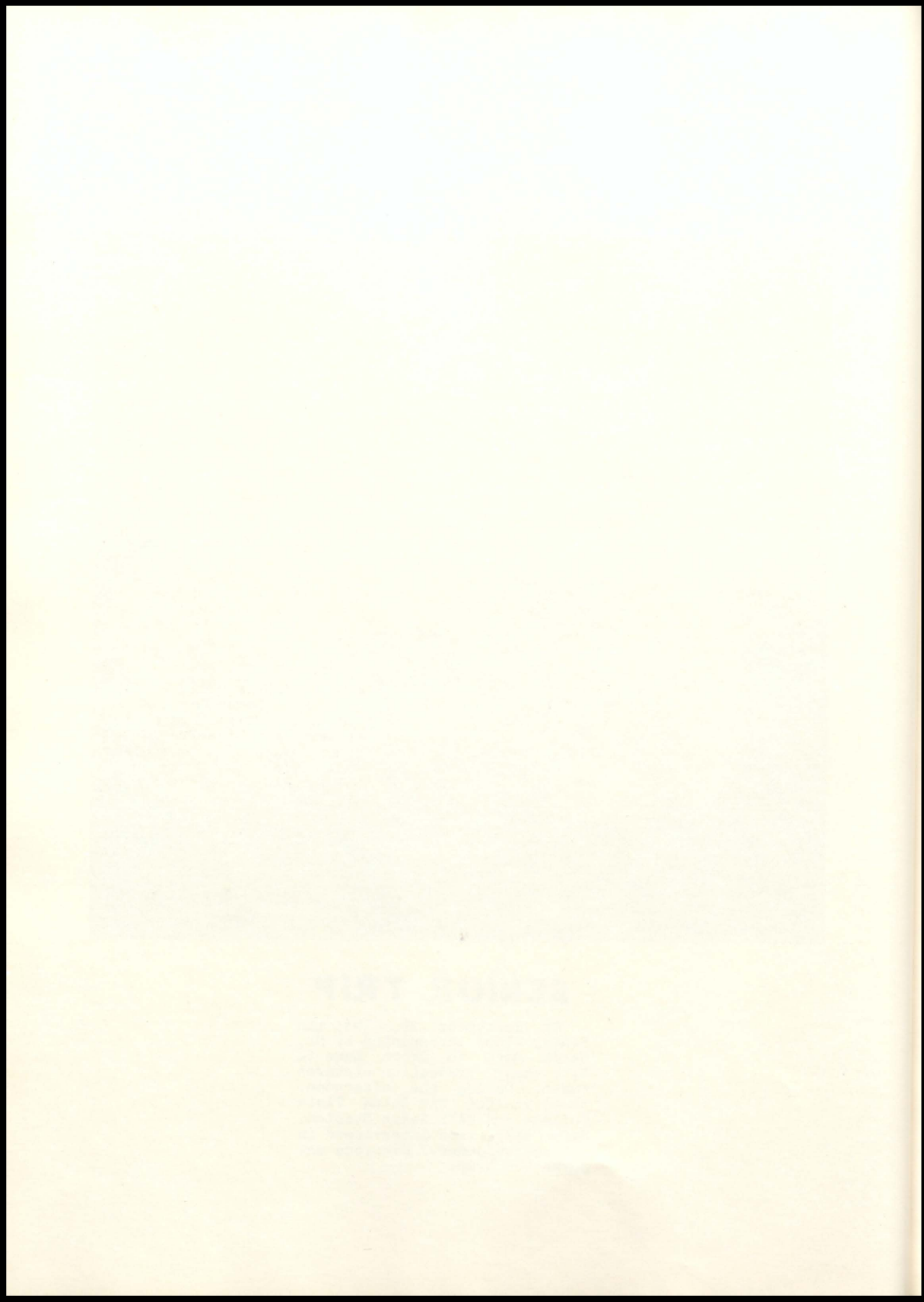






SENIOR TRIP

During this year we lost Jim Miller and Ronnie Plopper and added one more, Mary Lyman.

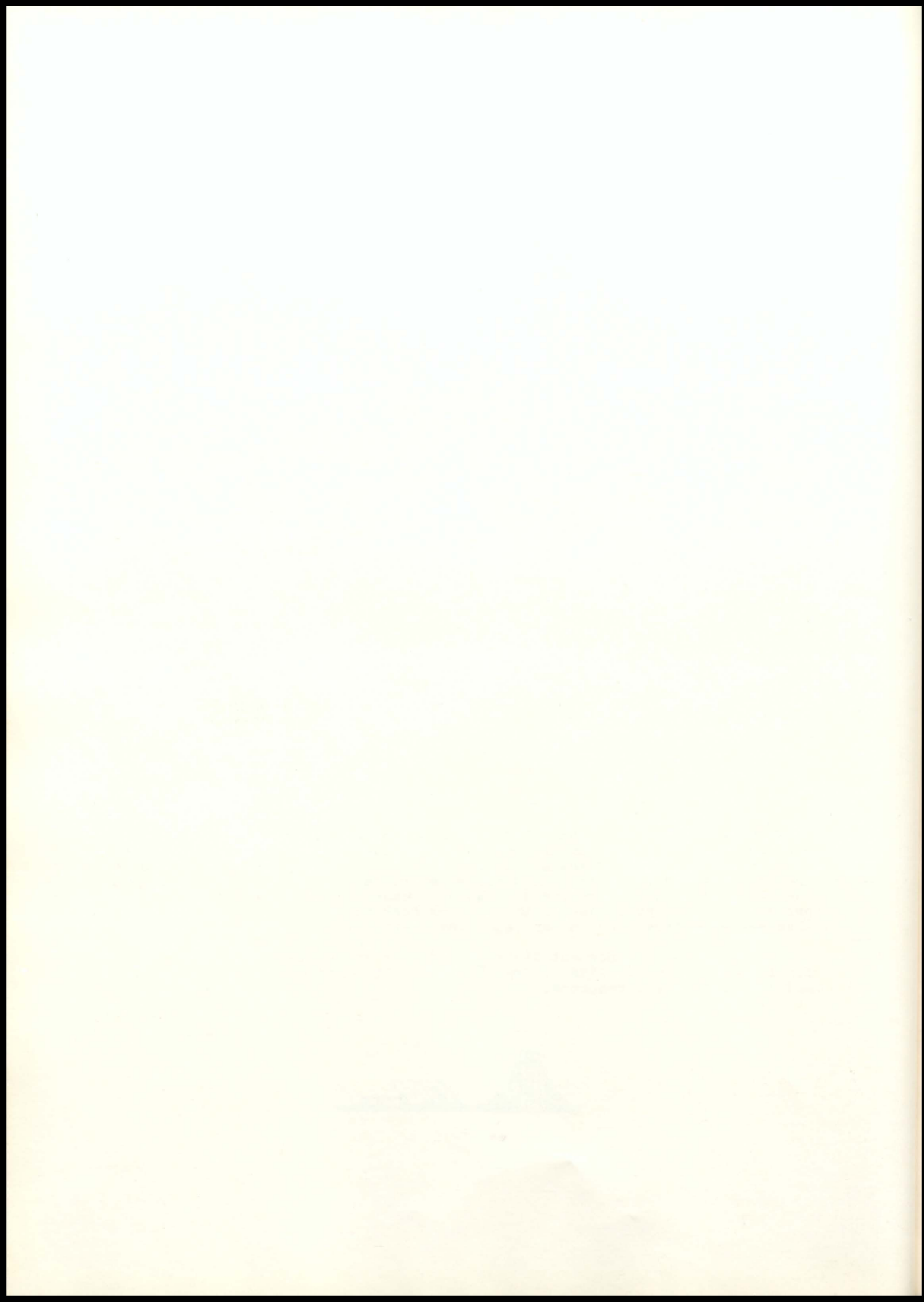
For our class officers our Junior year, we elected Elaine Steinbeck as President, Marlene Frerk as Vice-President, Karen Lenhart as Secretary, and Margie Orthmann as Treasurer. This year we worked hard to give the Seniors the usual Junior-Senior Banquet on April 23. The theme was "Moonlight and Roses". We sold mazazines as a means of making money. Lots of work, but it was fun. We ordered our class rings in December and received them when school started again in the fall. We presented "Desperate Ambrose", a comedy in three acts, as our Junior Play. It was a real success! We lost Allyn Davis, Dwain Salzkorn, Mary Lyman, and Loren Zoet before the year was up. Marilyn Elze joined us the last semester. Our sponser were Miss Camery and Miss Halbach.

During our Senior year, we continued to "do things" for Dear Old Sutherland High. We started the year with fourteen members as Roger Haydter and Elaine Steinbeck moved during the summer. For our class officers we elected Milowe Jungjohann as President, Margie Orthmann as Vice-President, Marlene Frerk as Secretary, and Bonnie Kleine as Treasurer. Our class sponser was Mr. Robinson. For our Senior Play, we used "The Groom said, No!" This was even a bigger hit than our Junior Class Play. In the spring came "Skip Day". Oh, what a day!

We were also pretty lucky in winning on two Homecoming floats. One of our boys helped play a major role on the football, basketball, and track teams for the past four years and the others for one or two years. One of the cheerleaders from the Senior class was represented for three years and the others for one or two years. We also excelled in dramatics. Besides presenting two plays, some of the Seniors took part in Declam contests. We also seemed outstanding in band and vocal activities.

And now, as Commencement Night gets nearer and we are about to take our final step, we would like to say "Good-bye" to Sutherland High School and all its friends and teachers.

Mr. McCurdy switches off the machine and turns to his partner and says, "Well, Jungjohann, it looks like most of your classmates have done some great things."

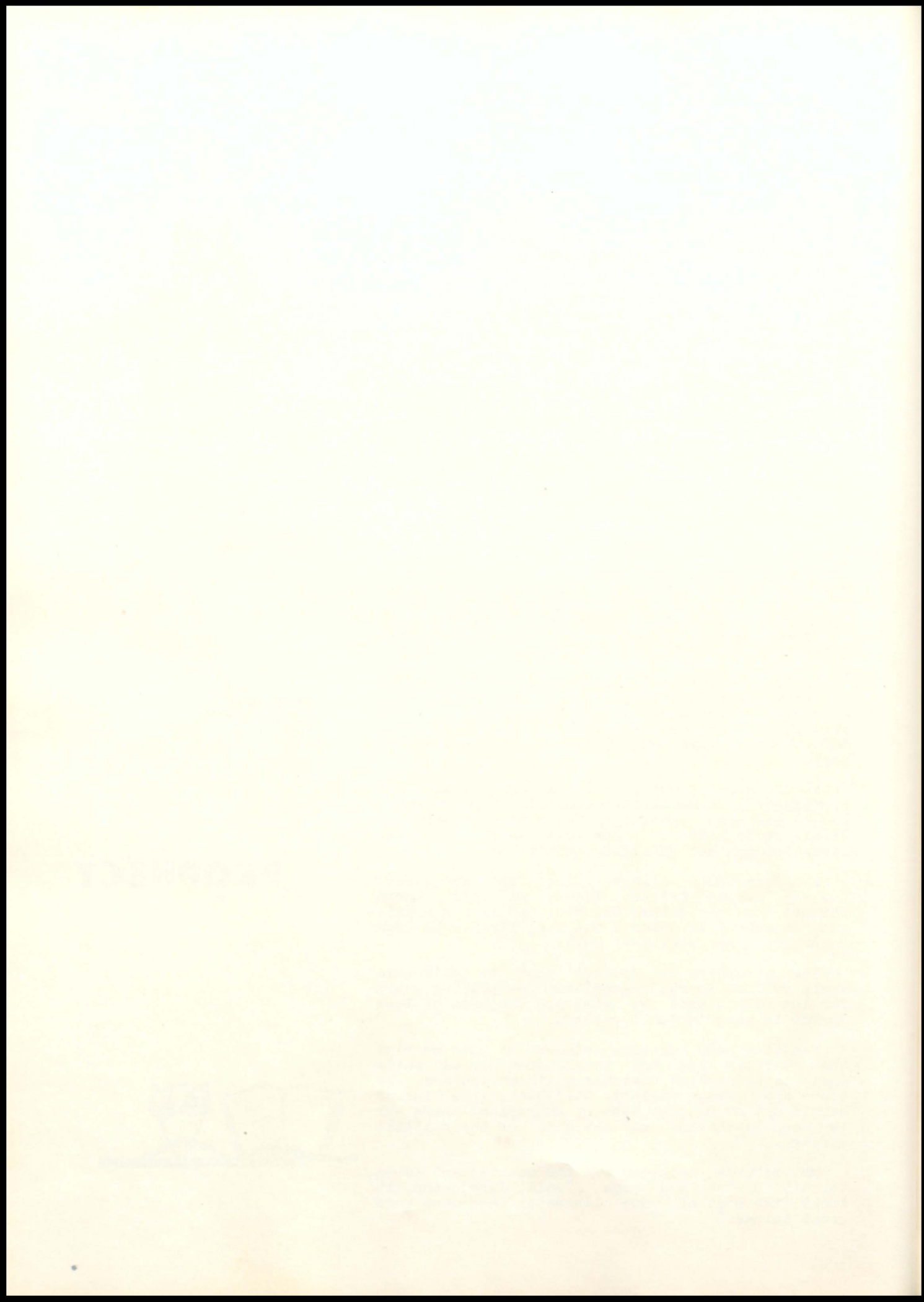

We will and bequeath to the Freshmen our three boys. A few more won't make too much difference.

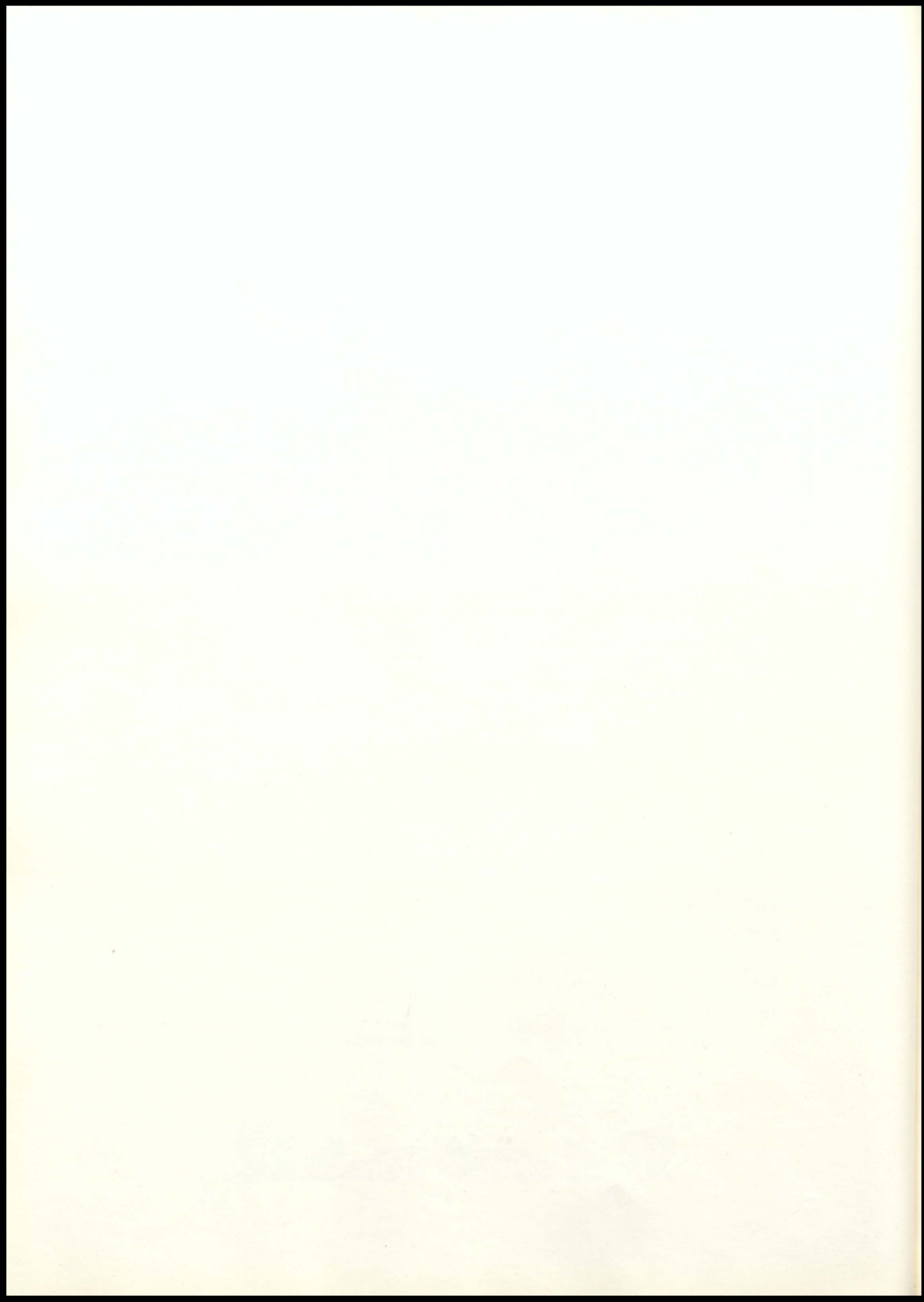
ITEM II:

ITEM XIII:

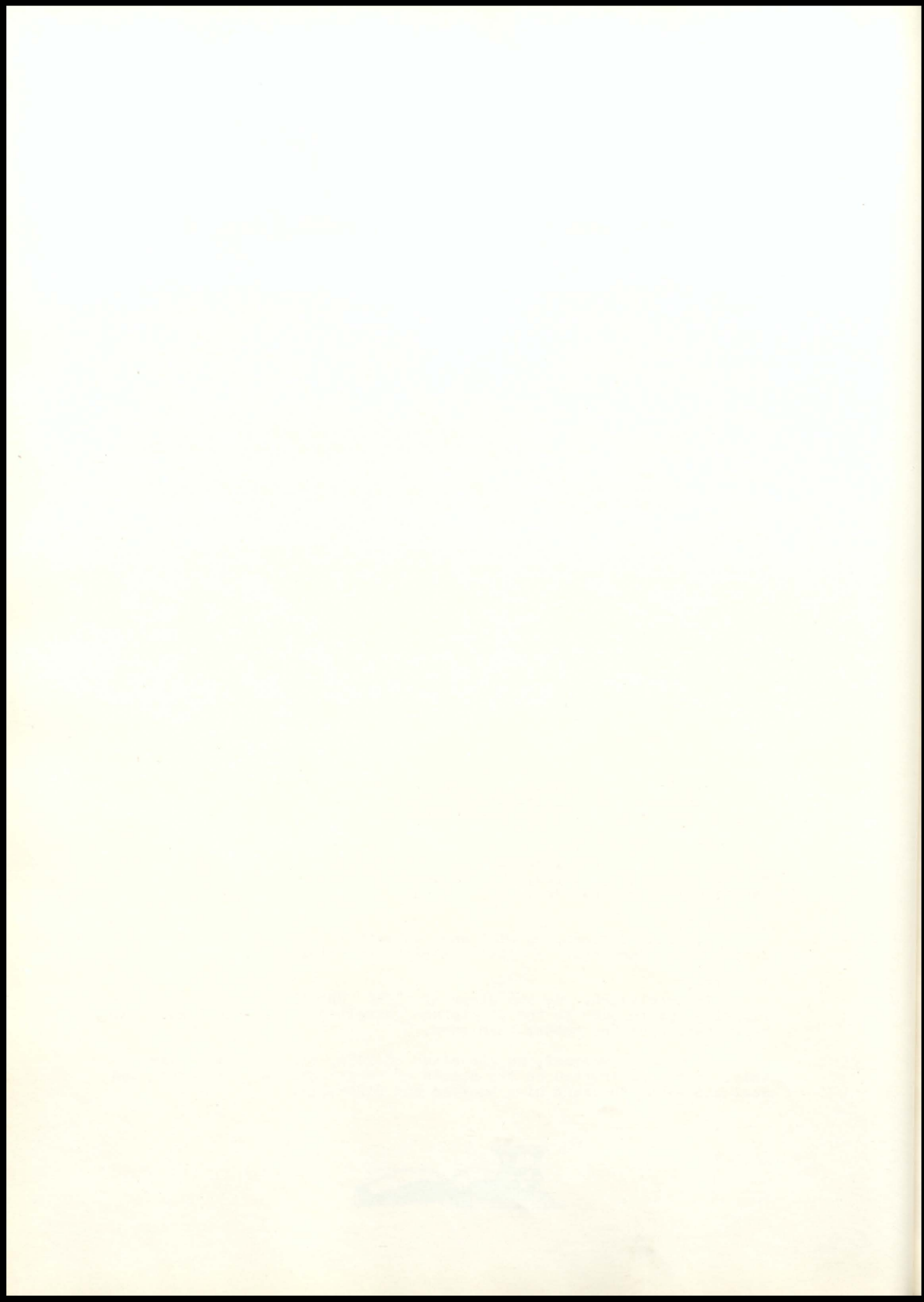
I, Donna Wohlert, do will and bequeath my ability to have a job to you, Judy Jennings. A little extra money helps alot.

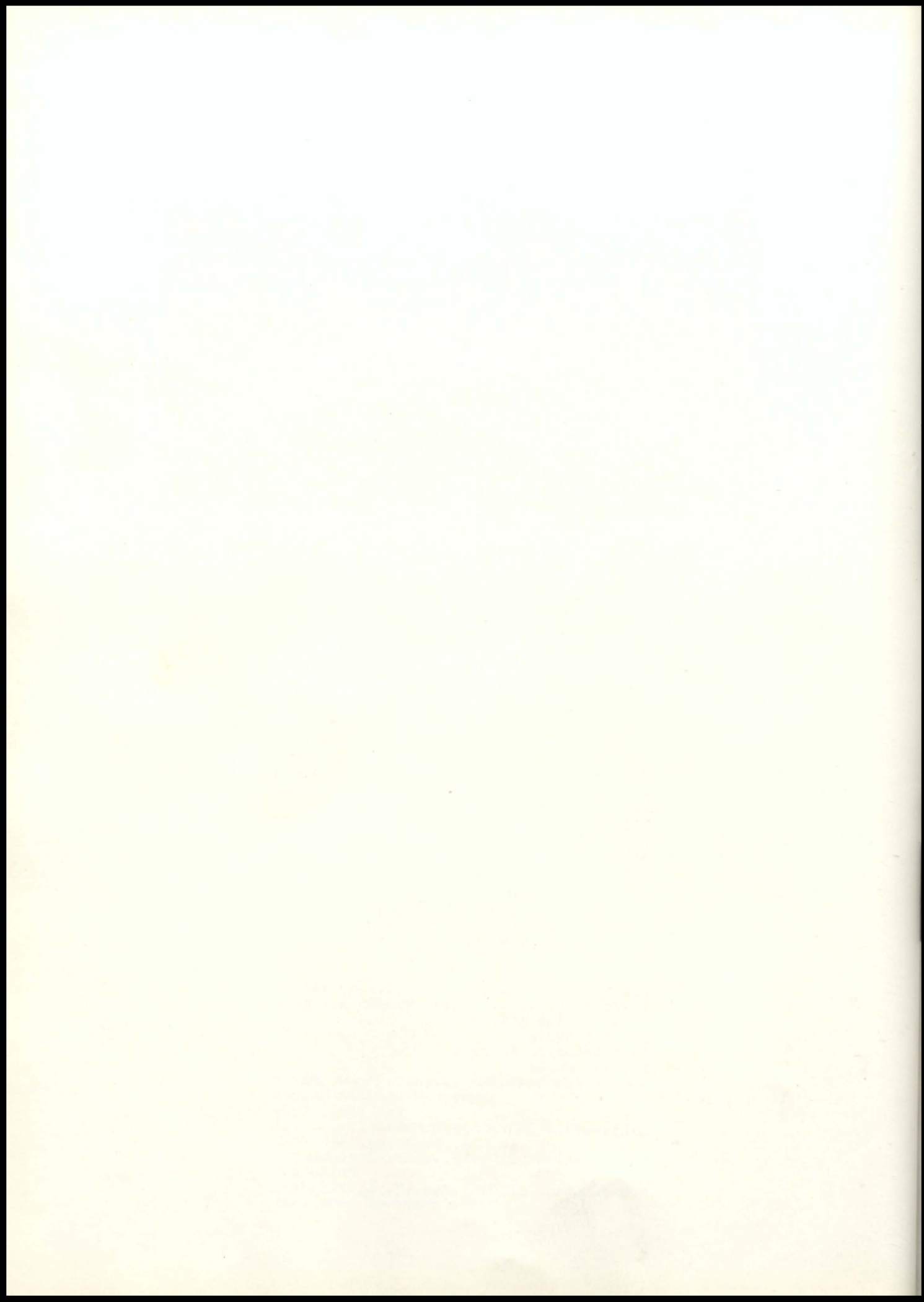
ITEM IXX:

In conclusion, we the Class of "56" do will and bequeath the lighting system back to the people who installed it back in 1921. We hope their eyes are better than ours.

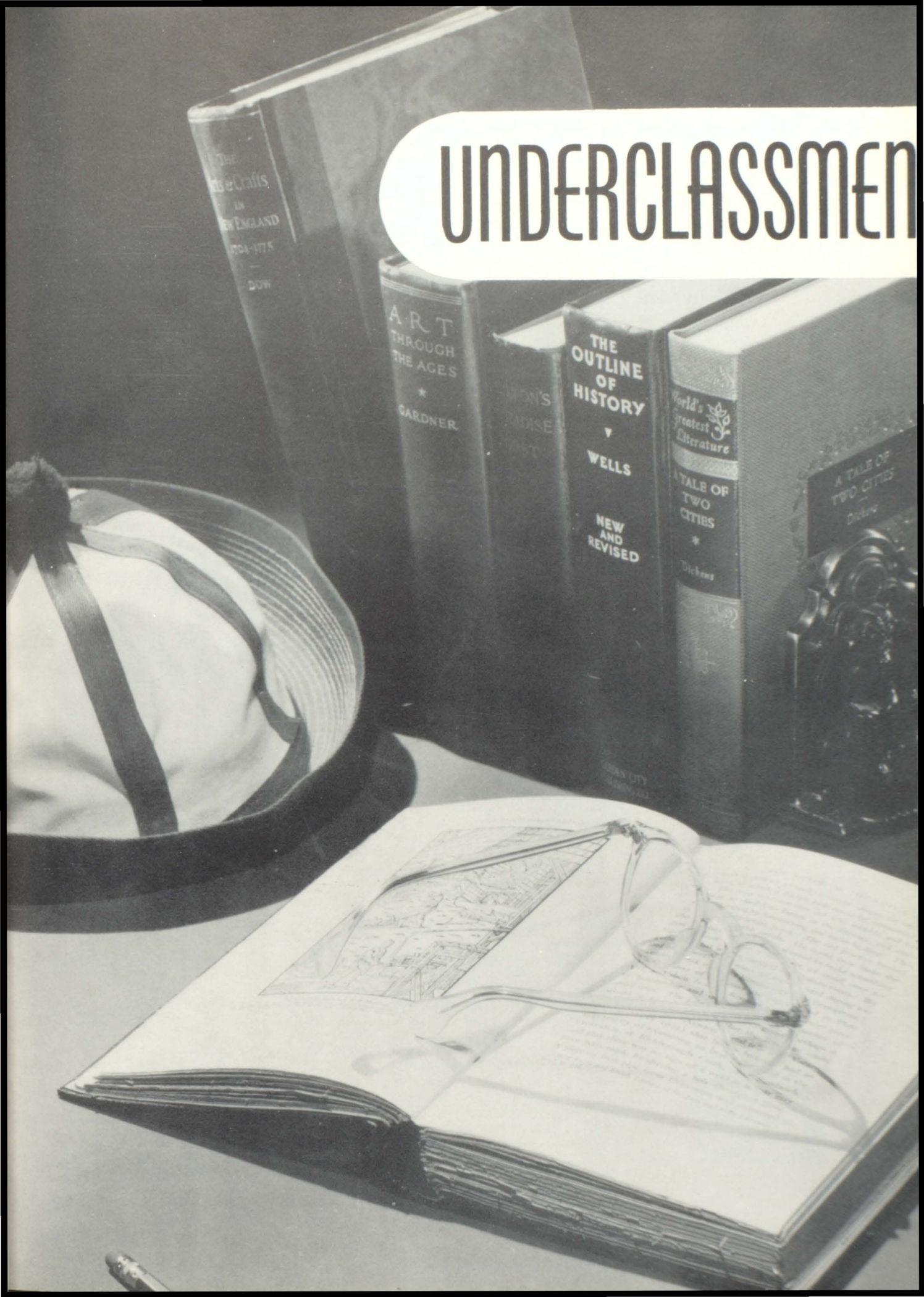

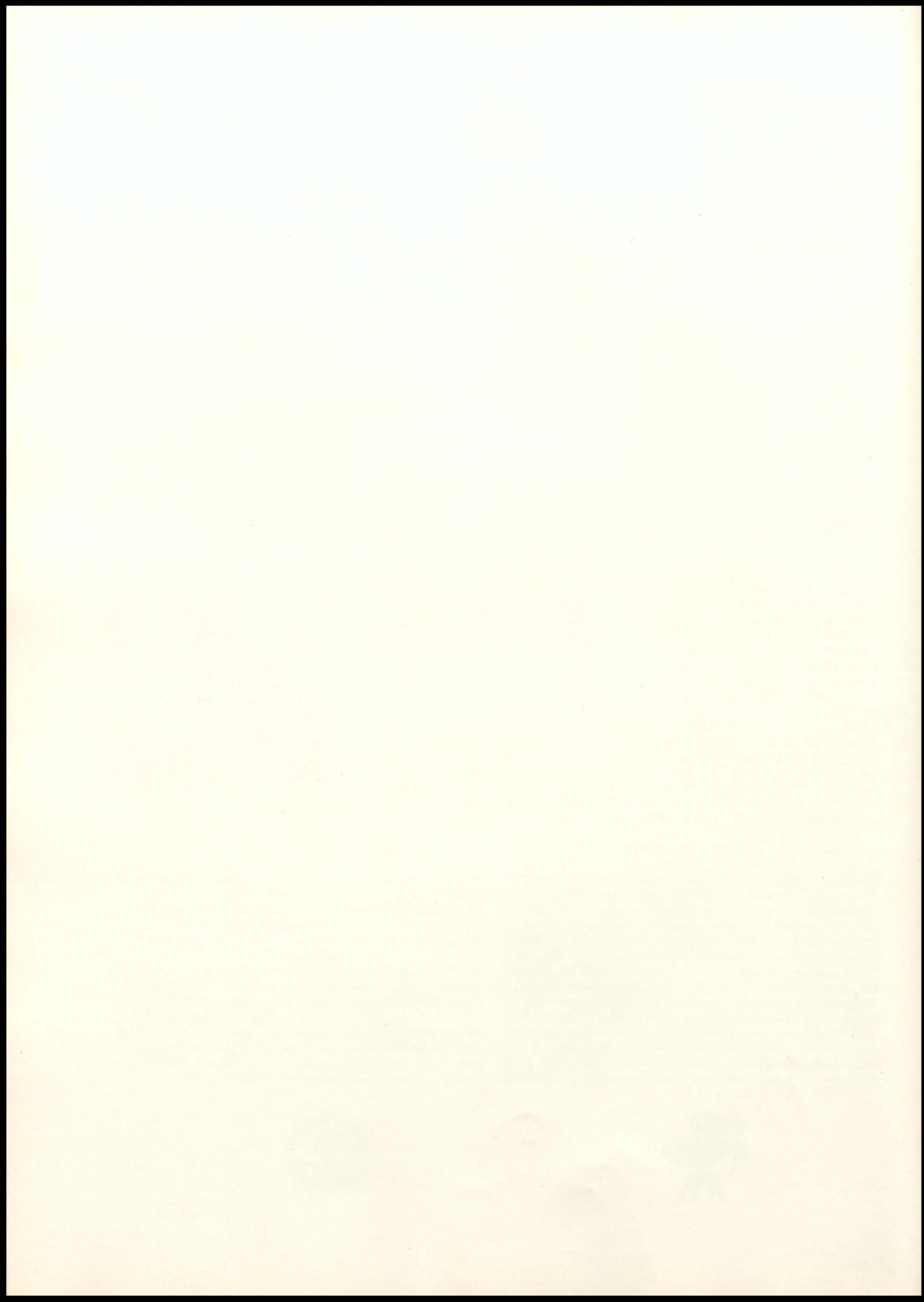
The Junior Class Play, Beauty and the Beef, was presented November 4, 1955 under the direction of Miss Ross.

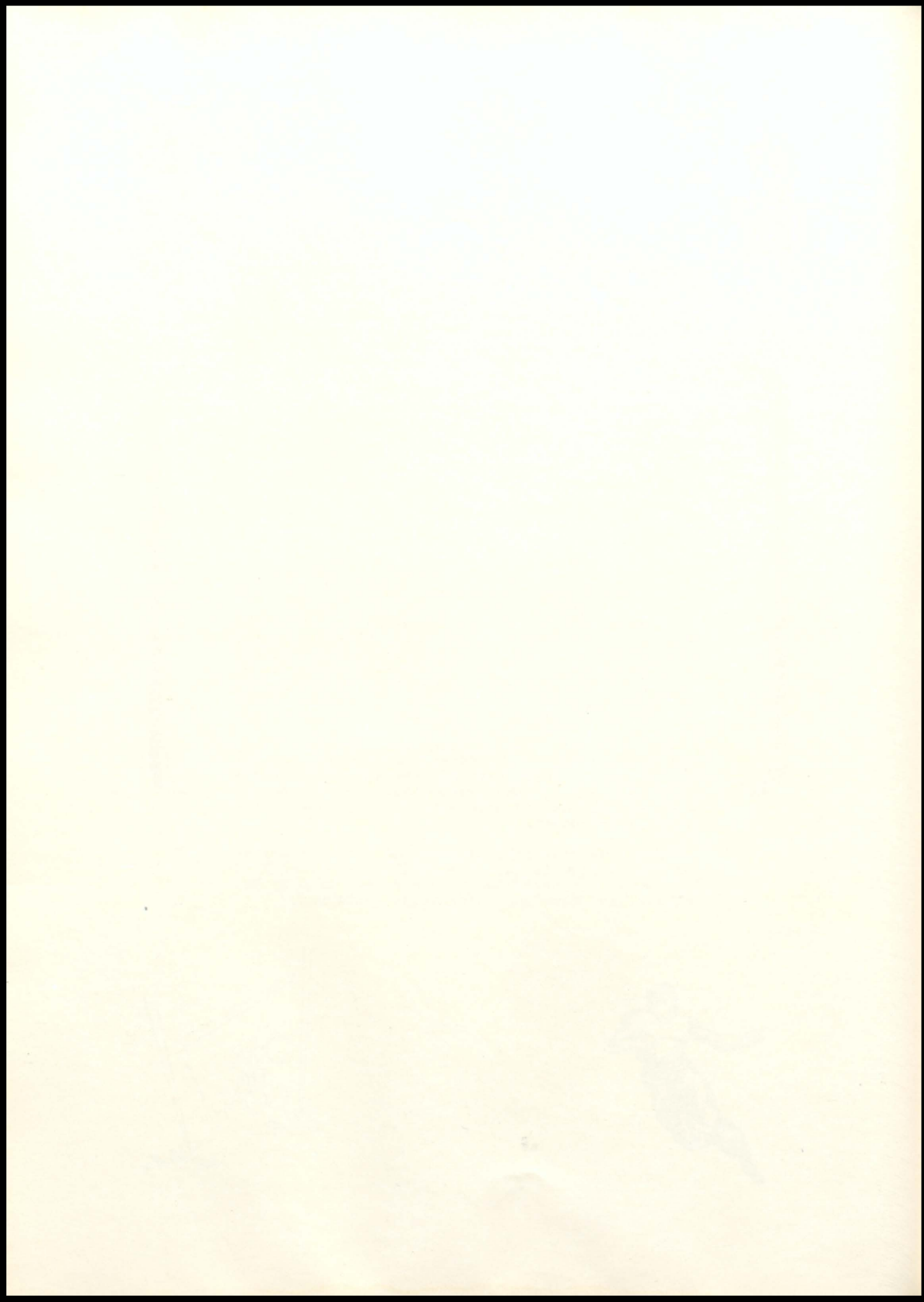
The Homecoming parade started at 1:30 including the band, football players, Queen and attendents, floats, and the grade students riding their bikes.
