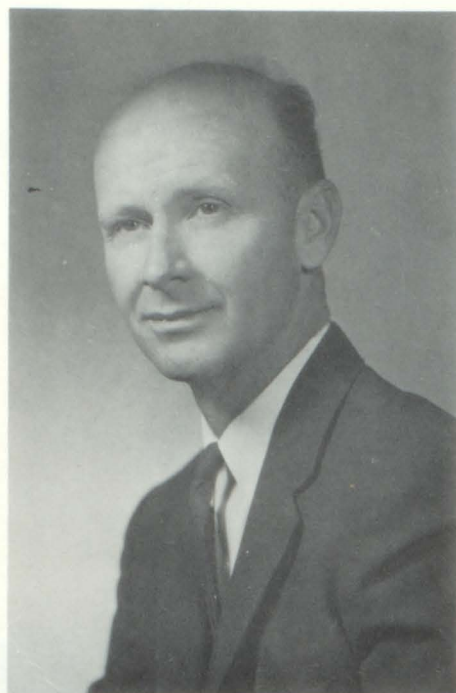


## FOREWORD
