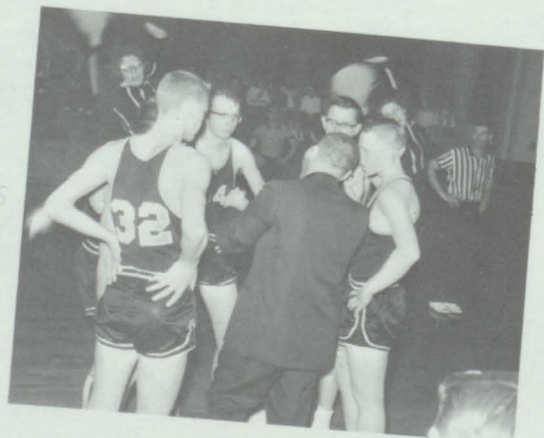

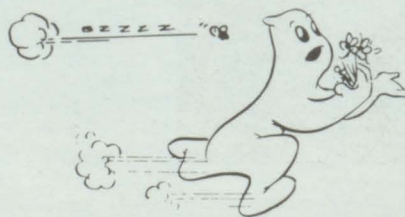

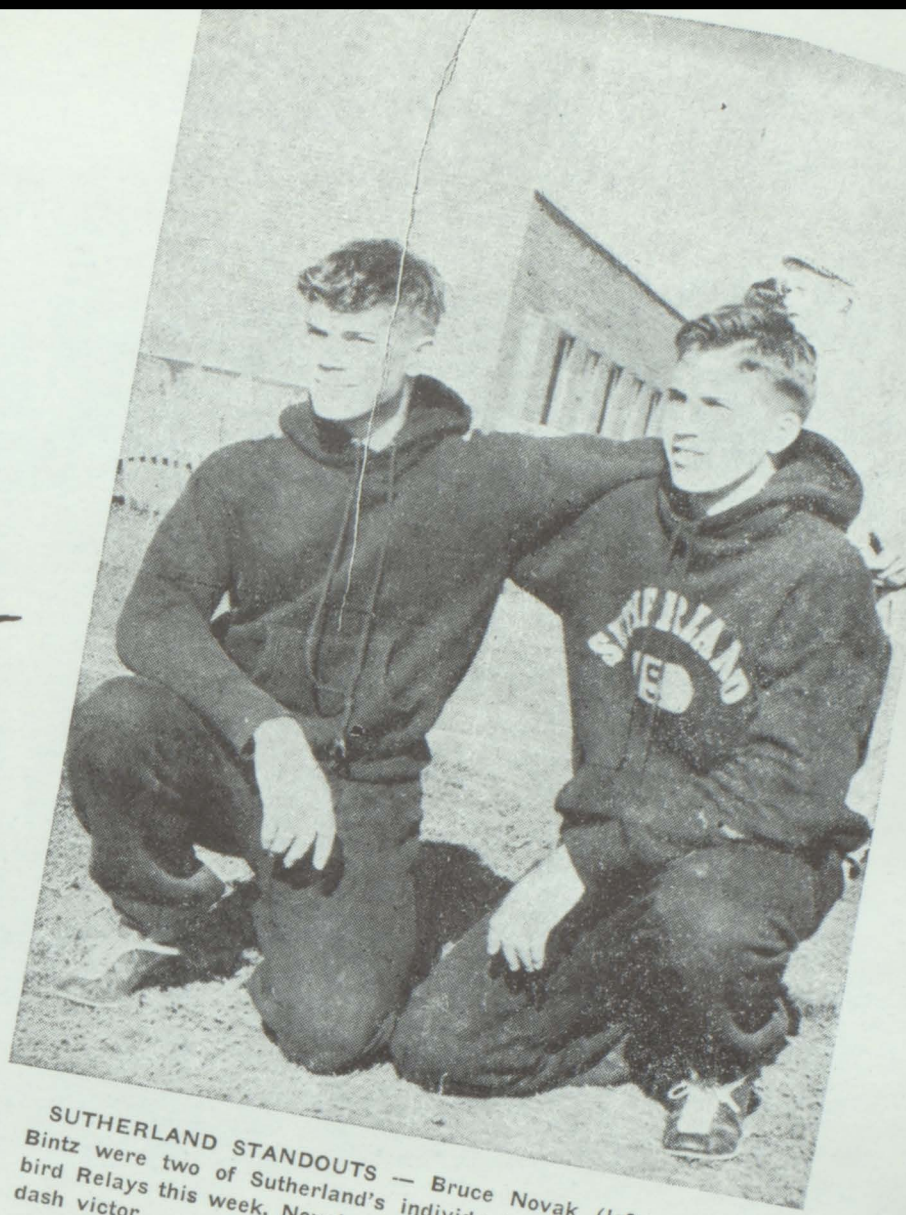


R. Metz anchors winning medley at Pa-Su-Sa meet.

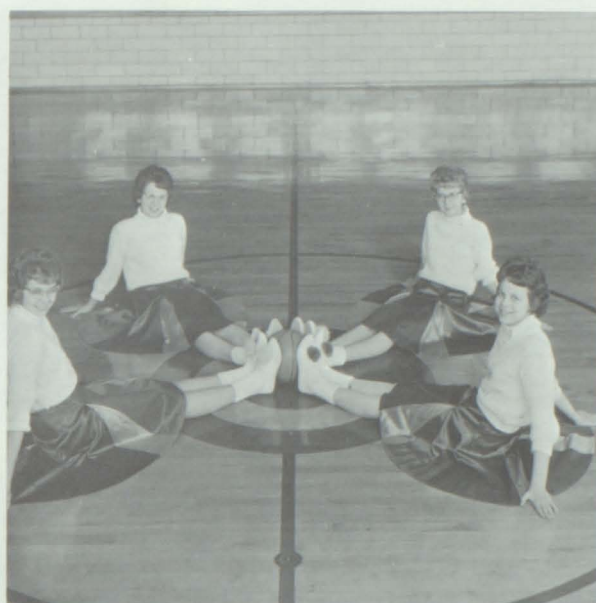

The Tigers surprised the Milford football team in the last game of the season with a 26 to 14 victory. It was truly an upset as Milford stood second in the conference prior to the game.

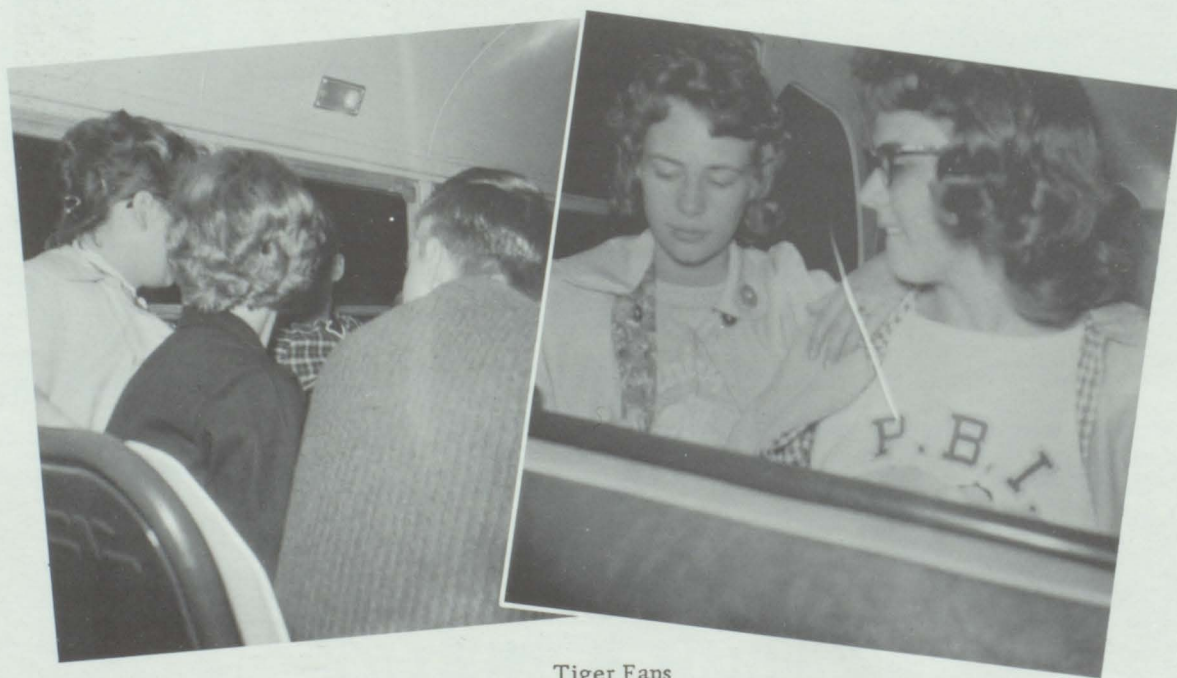
