Three awards are made each year to certain Senior Class members. This year, Principal Leon Stanford presented the Sutherland

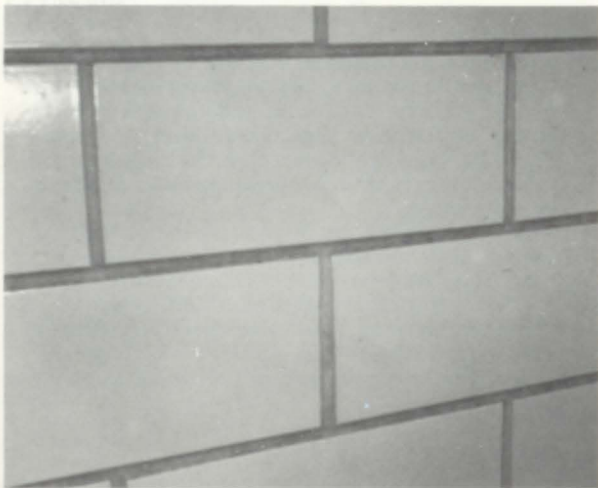

The Sutherland Tigers finished the 1968-1969 basketball season with a disappointing record. In a major rebuilding year, only two seniors, Paul Mugge and Dennis Lundquist, started most games. As a result, the junior-dominated squad under head coach, Gary Williams, was unable to succeed against rugged opposition in the Sioux Valley Conference. Having to play the undefeated Class A State Champions, Paullina, three times did not improve the Tiger's record. Of course, second-place in the conference was captured by Alta, a team that advanced within one game of entering the field of eight at the State Championship. Despite this major opposition, the Tigers always managed to entertain their loyal fans with their spirit and determination, winning seven games and losing twelve. As an indication of his fine shooting and rebounding, Paul Mugge was placed on the Second-Team All Sioux Valley Conference. The Junior Varsity squad completed a successful season, winning half of its games. Several of the freshman and sophomore players are expected to challenge the varsity members for positions next year. Only the knee injury to their big center, Kim Heckert, kept Coach Becker's Jr. Tigers from an even better record. Seventh and Eighth Grade Teams completed a very successful basketball season, following an undefeated football campaign. Under the direction of their head coach, Doug Conrad, the Calumet Indians handily defeated several teams from the Sioux Valley Conference, losing a combined total of only three games.

The Sutherland track team completed a very successful season, despite the number of inexperienced underclassmen on the squad. This year the field-events men accumulated many of the points earned at the various meets. Dan Joines and Steve Steele, throwing the discus and shot-put respectively, were able to establish new record marks at many track meets. Neither one, however, was able to break the local high school record. Paul Mugge achieved his best performance at Cherokee when he set a new school record in the pole vault by clearing twelve feet. The climax of the season occurred when the team won the championship trophy for the second straight year at the Hawk Relays at Hartley. Four members of the track team were able to qualify for the State Track Meet and traveled to Cedar Rapids, only to be nearly washed away in a heavy downpour. Next year, the team is expected to be much stronger in the running events with the return of experienced members.

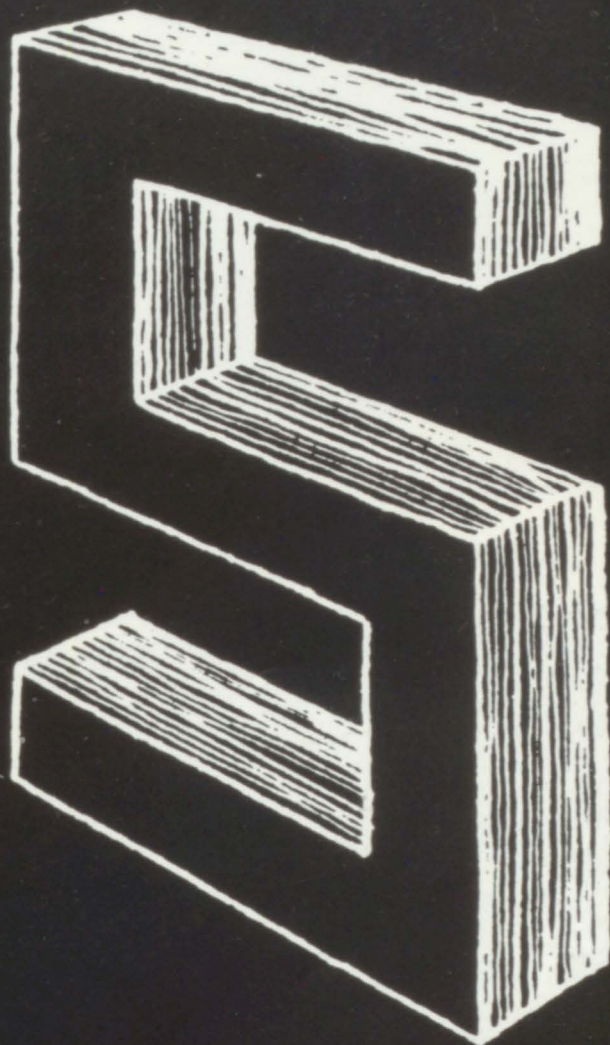
