# DEDICATION

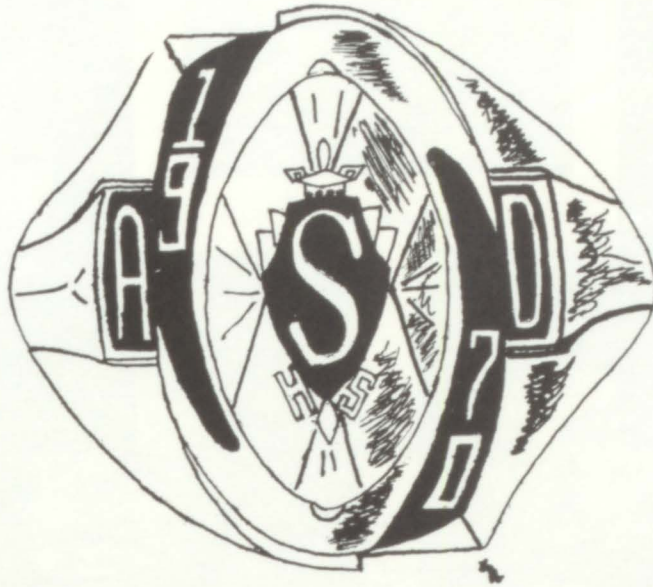

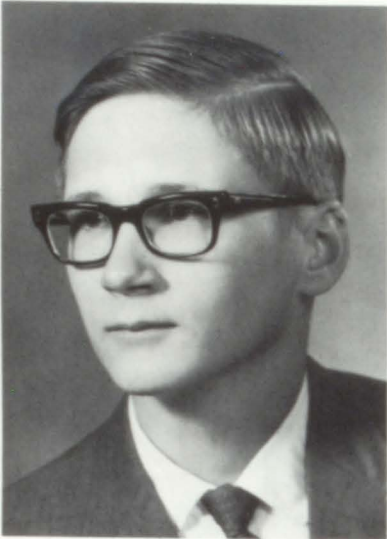
On his spare time, he helps students with whatever problem they have. He is one of the Sophomore sponsors, and also films all the basketball games, and football games.

Mr. Frolkey enjoys working at the F and F Drive-In, cruising down the rivers in his self-made boat, and singing in the Methodist choir.

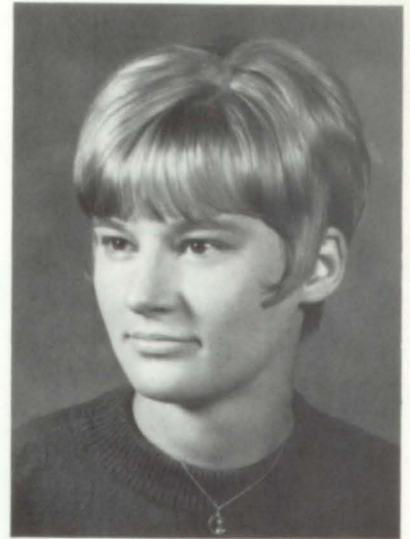

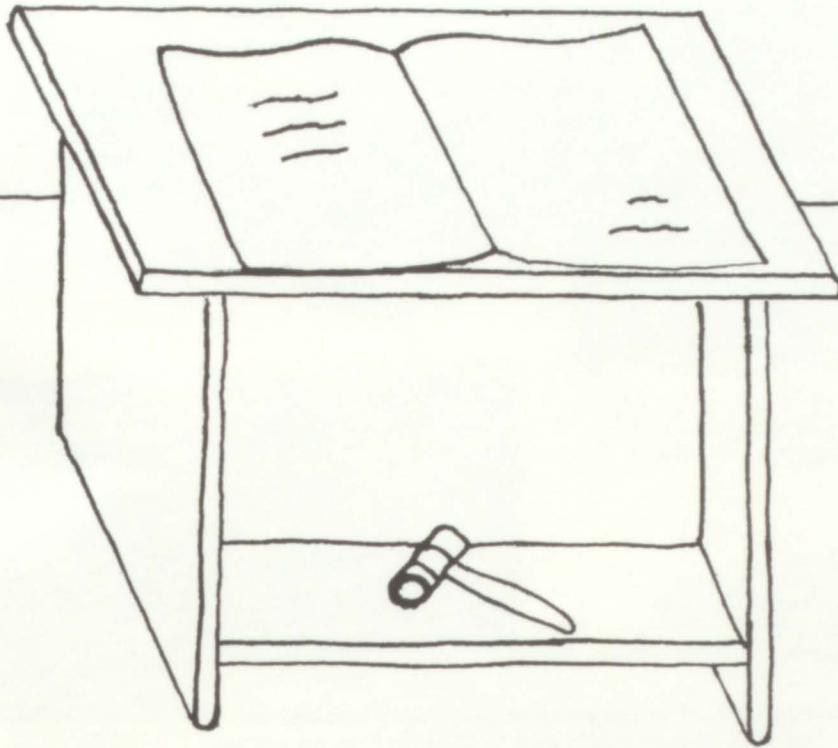

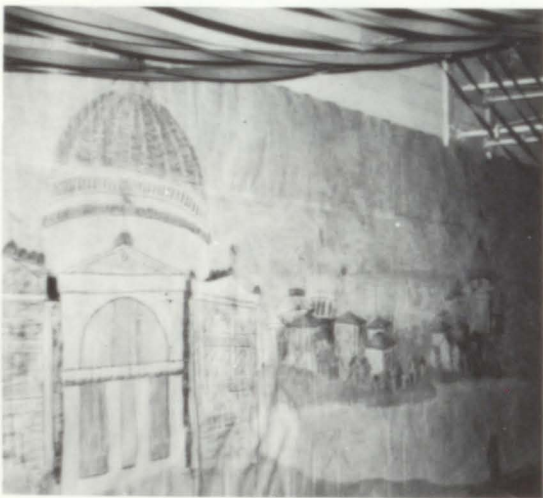
