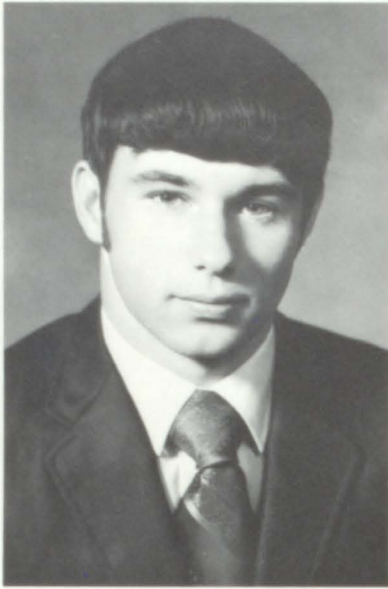
DALE NIELSEN

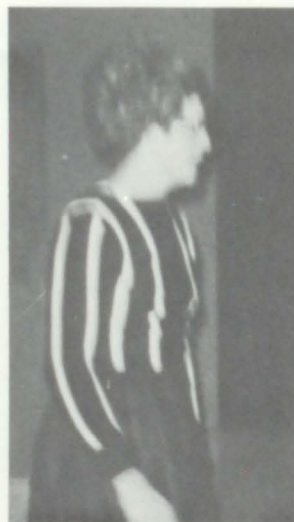

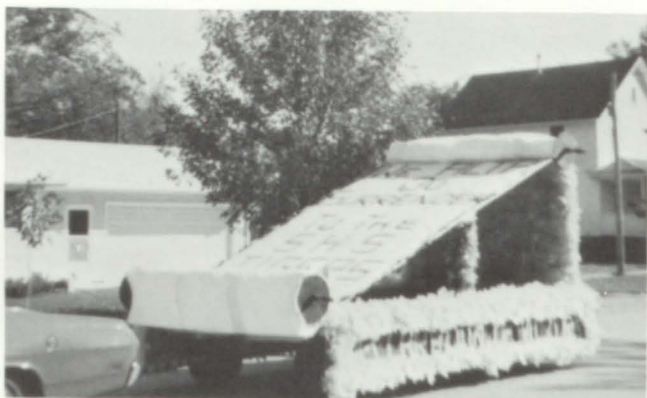

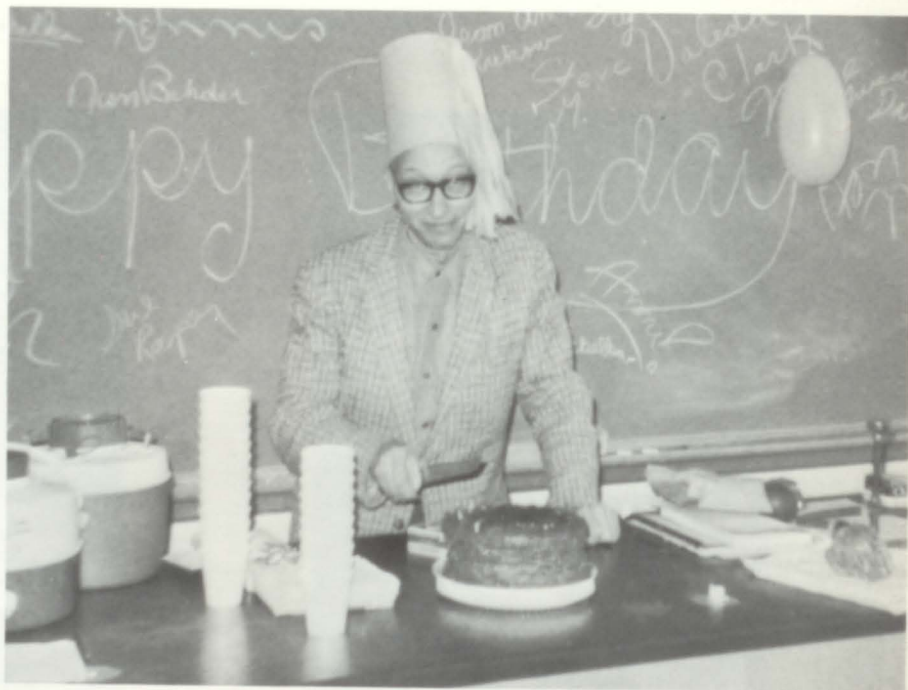


SENIOR SEND OFF

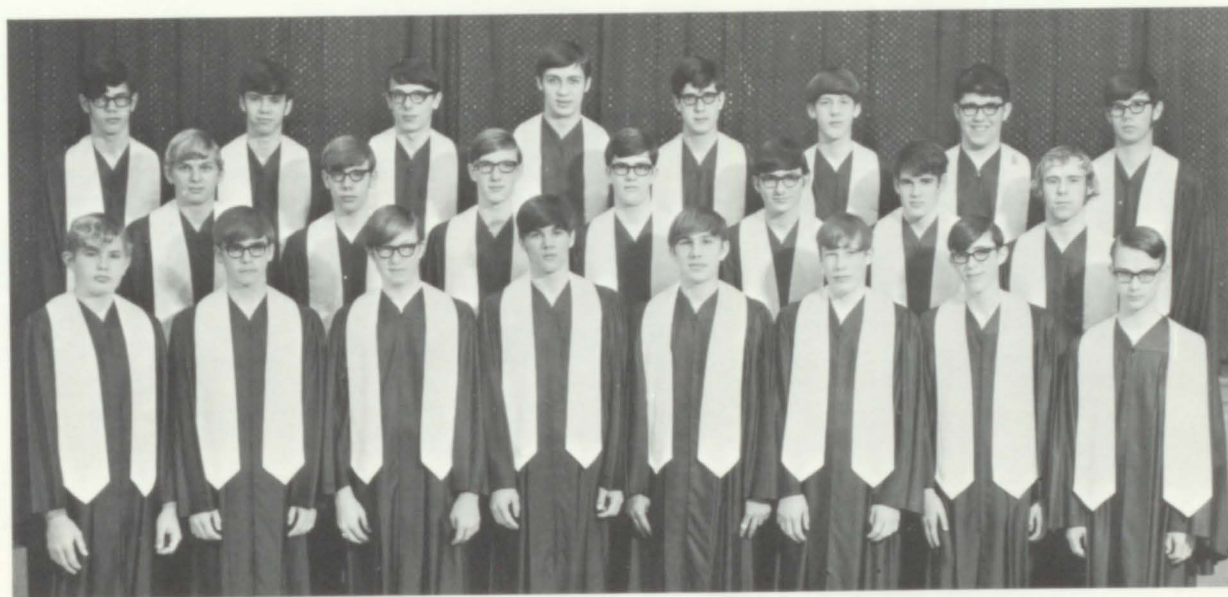
