

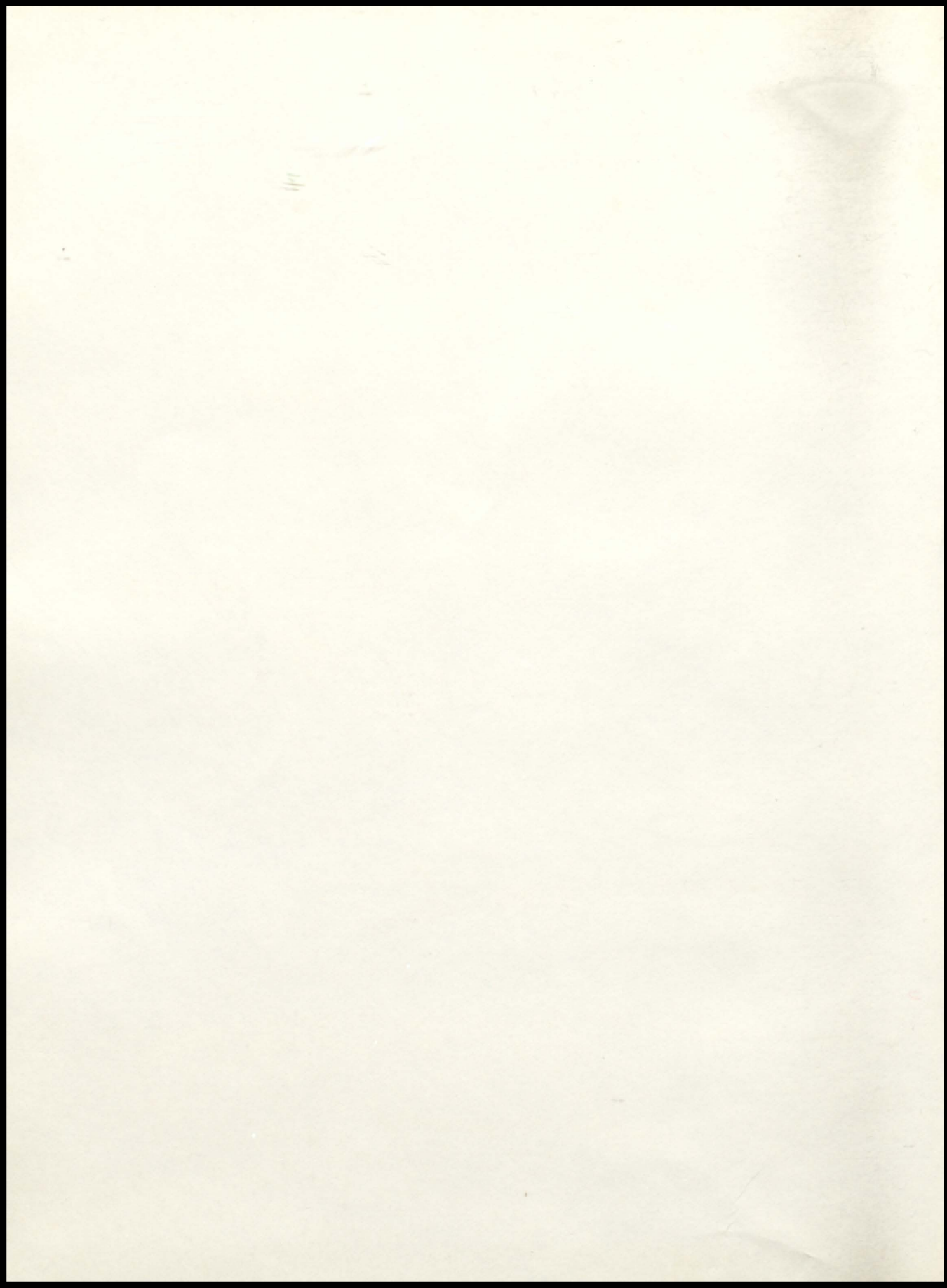

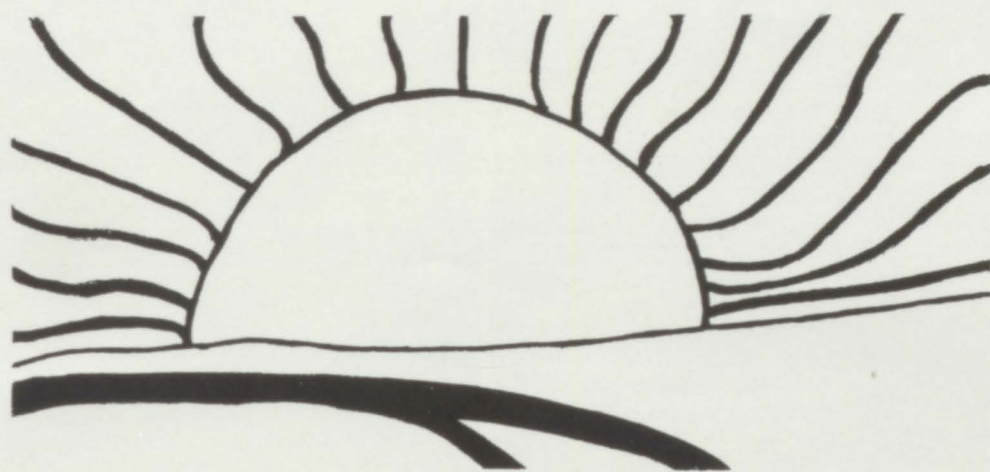

Note From The Annual Staff

We, the annual staff saved this space just to tell you a little about all the work that we put into the making of this annual and to say thanks to a few people and businesses.

The annual staff is chosen in the spring of the year by the returning members of the previous staff. Two seniors and three juniors were selected. Students that are not too involved in other activities are chosen, so that they will have plenty of time to spend on the making of the new annual. At the time one of the previous members is also appointed to be the new editor. The editor is chosen in the spring so that he or she may work closely with finishing up the annual because there is alot for that person to learn about the annual.

The staff consists of seven members, an editor and an advisor. This year our advisor was Mr. Del Brink. He has gone through all the learning process along with the rest of us this year because he had not been involved with the annual staff before. The staff begins work on the upcoming year in the summer. Three of the returning members go to a workshop put on by Josten's Yearbook Company. It is held in Storm Lake at the college. Here they learn how to put the entire annual together and get some new ideas to add a little interest to the annual. They also begin to plan the full layout of the pages and how each section will look.

The first time that the whole staff gets together is an important happening. The new members are taught how to do pages, and generally how the whole entire annual is put together. The editor also tries to get some of the staff's ideas about the annual. Then, about a week before school starts they all take off to Spencer to sell advertising. The staff takes two days out of school to sell ads in Cherokee and the surrounding towns plus the day in Spencer and a day during Christmas vacation to sell them in Sutherland. A Total of about 25 hours is spent by the staff on selling ads. Also during the year the staff sells the annuals. This year 154 were sold in advance, however we do order 200 every year and we usually get them all sold in the fall when they arrive.

About January the staff begins work on the pages of the annual. Approximately 2-5 hours goes into each page, so alot of time is put into the pages. The pages are sent into the plant where they are printed in three shipments of 32 pages each. The first one is in the month of April and the others are about a month apart. A total of about 400 hours are spent on making the pages of the book. That just about sums up all it takes to put the annual together except the clean up and getting the new one on the way.

The staff would like to thank all the persons that have helped to make this annual a success. Especially the businesses who advertised in the annual. If it were not for them we would not be able to afford to print this annual. We would also like to thank all the teachers. They really have to put up with a lot while we are taking the pictures and let us out of school to sell ads. Mr. Stanford, thanks for putting up with us, and Mr. Brink, for trying to learn along with the rest of us and trying to keep all the responsibilities straight.

We would also like to thank Denny Holton from Cherokee Daily Times and Mr. Chaffee for taking pictures for their papers and then letting us have the pictures at no cost to us. Another thank you should go to Bob from Buntrock Salie Studio in Storm Lake for taking all of our group pictures.

A special thanks must go to all of you who have purchased one of these annuals and one of the cute figurines that we sold, because if it weren't for you this annual wouldn't be what it is.

We would appreciate all the comments you have on the annual. Every one will be considered and in the future it will help us to make a better annual for all of you. Any suggestions will also help us out tremendously.

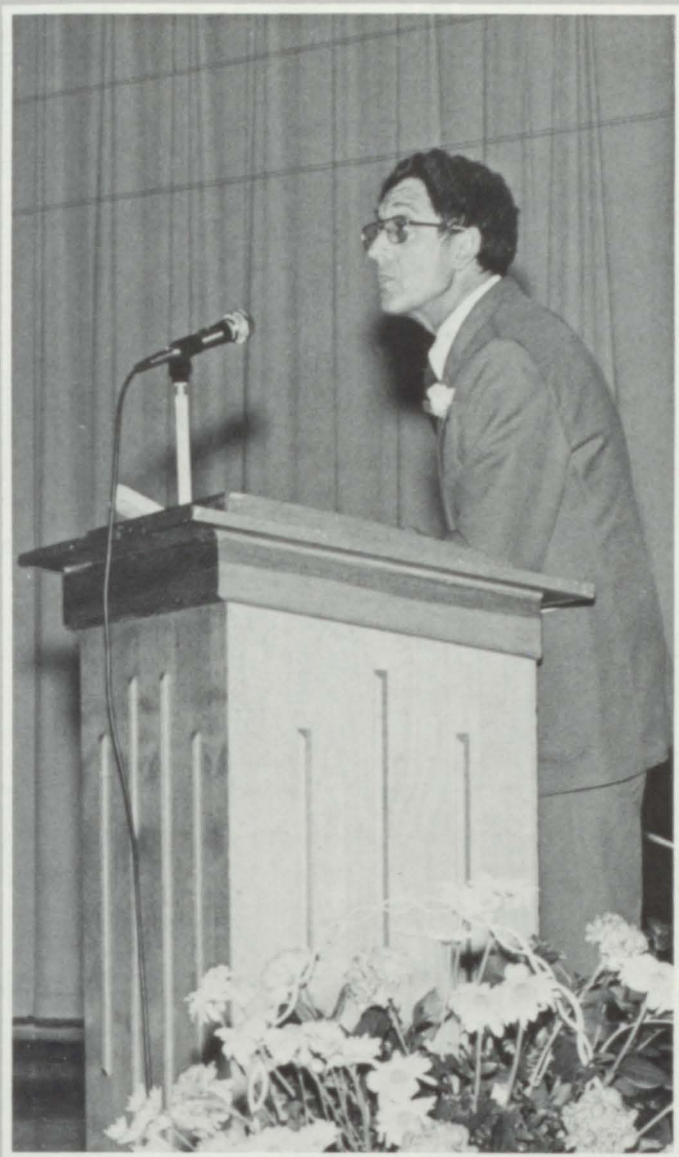

The success of the team this year seemed to lie in the spirit and determination of the team-particularly the seniors. The team owed alot to those five girls.

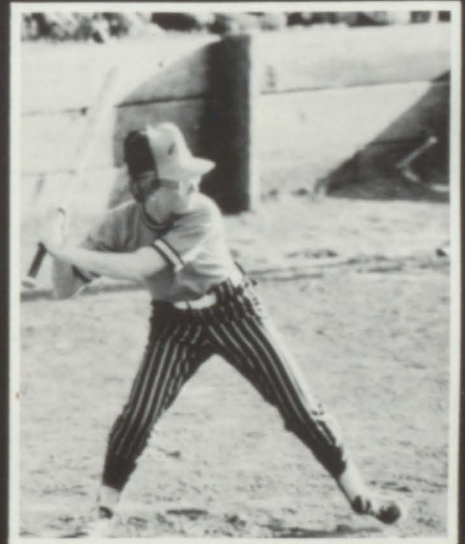

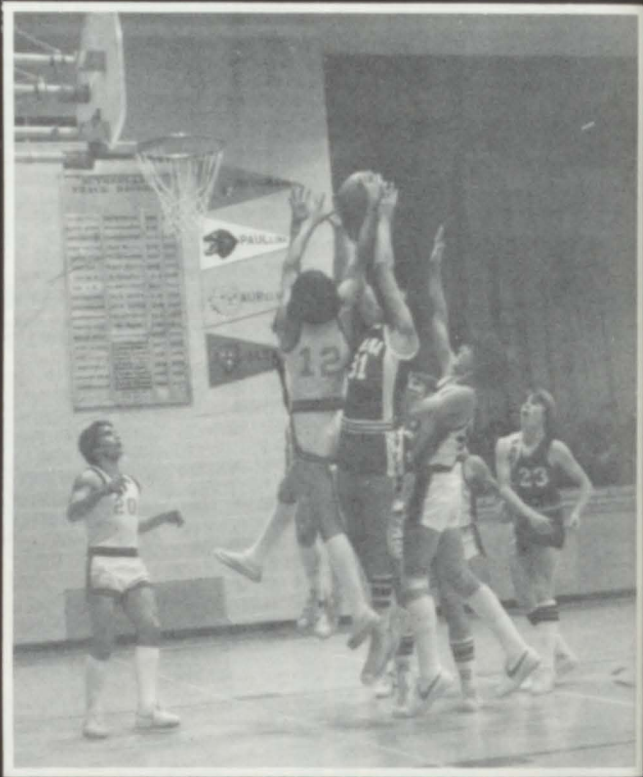
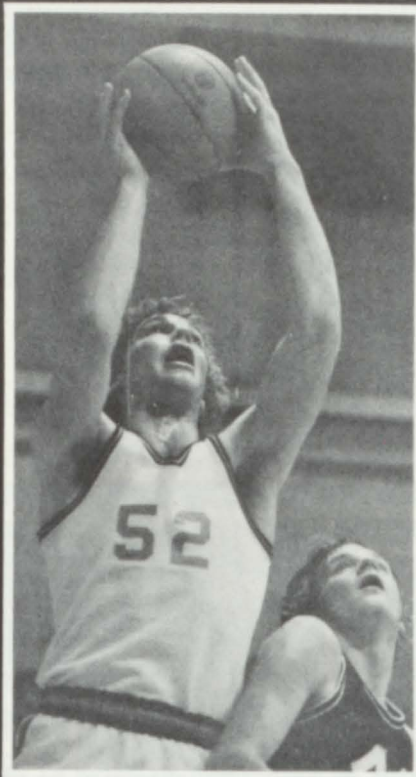


OFFENSE DEFENSE

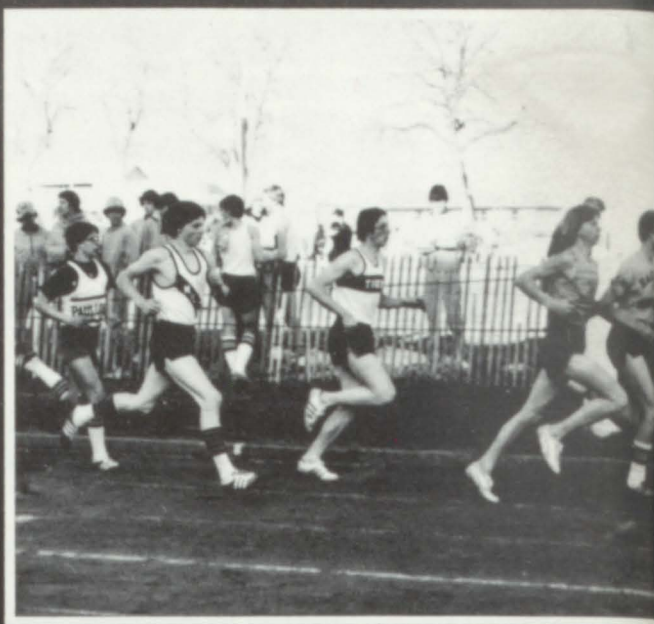
GET SET GO

The team went to the conference meet knowing that they were the defending champions and of course they pulled through again, bringing home the trophy once again.

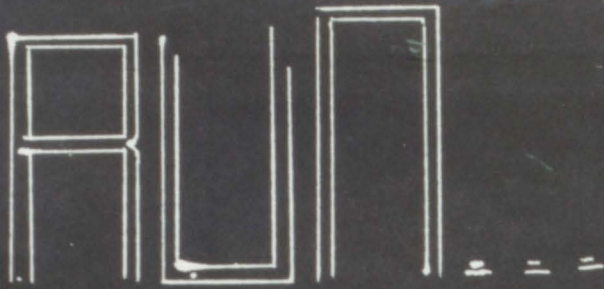

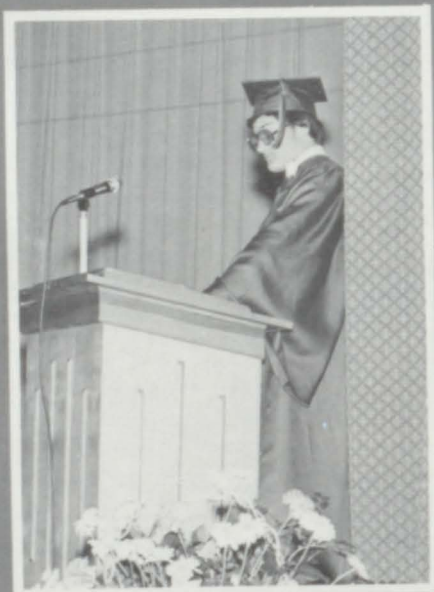


Honor Society 1980
