To every thing there is a season, and a time to every purpose under the heaven.

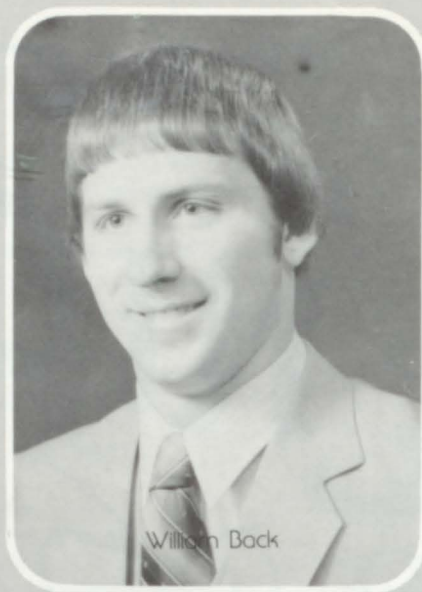
A time to be born, and a time to die:

The close of 1982-1983 school year also marks the retirements of two administrators who have long provided guidance within the Sutherland school district. These two men, Mr. Rhode and Mr. Stanford, have presided over our school for approximately twenty years. Both have had distinguished careers in education; consequently, we shall all deeply feel their absences next year. Mr. Rhode began his career by graduating from Buena Vista College in 1950. He moved to Adair and taught there until 1954; then he moved to Hansell and pursued the same duties. In 1958 he was on the move again, to Superior, and then in 1959 to Calumer; he served as superintendent in both districts. In 1961 he became the junior high principal in Calumer and in 1965 the superintendent of our district, a position he held through this year. And, in the future, he is planning to move to his home in Okoboji, take one day at a time, and fish. Similarly, Mr. Stanford graduated from Buena Vista, but in 1948. He taught for ten years in Cleghorn and left for Royal in 1957 to pursue the same positions he had had in Cleghorn — principal and teacher. He stayed in Royal until 1963 and then came to Sutherland, where he has been principal and teacher for the past 20 years. Upon retiring, Mr. Stanford will be at home on his farm near Larrabee and plans on travelling and fishing.

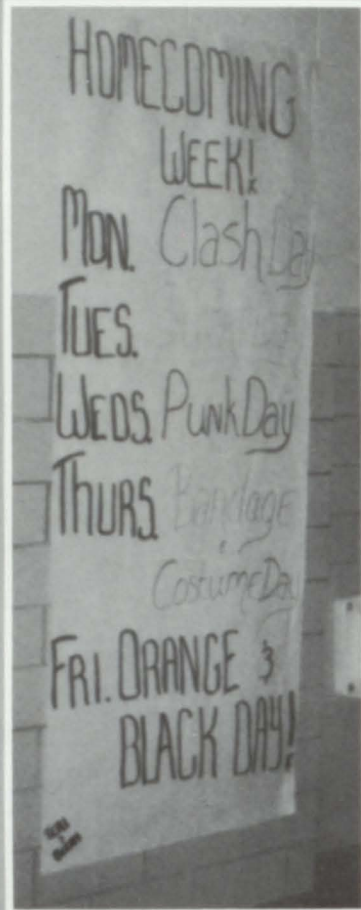
A Weekend To Remember

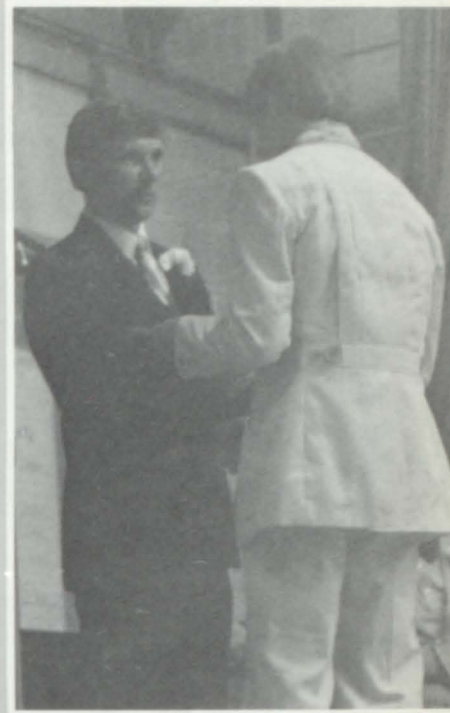
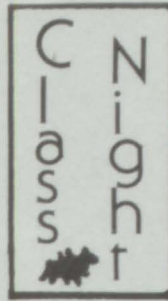

And it does.



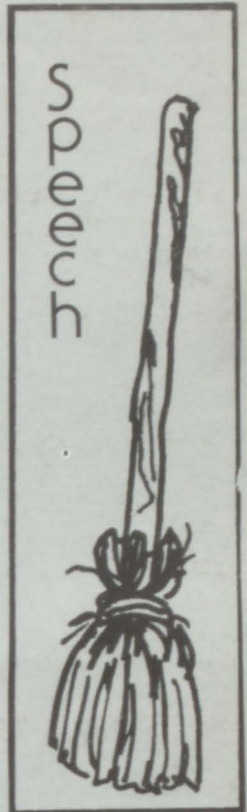

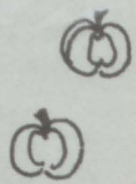

to Broadway





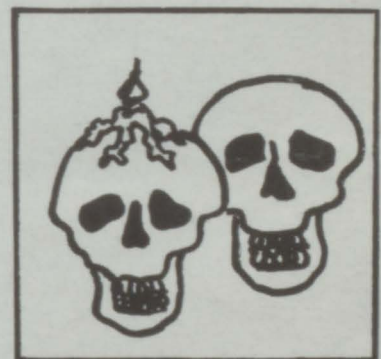

The Calumet Jr. High jazz band is composed of 8 trumpeters, 7 saxes, 5 rhythm people, and 2 trombones. Because of a lack of trombones in the Jr. High, substitutions have been added to make a fuller sound, as well as increased participation. Two baritone players fill in on Valve trombone and two bass clarinet are used for one of the parts making a total of 6 trombones playing four parts.

The Jr. High jazz band is mostly a training group, but does perform for both the winter and spring concerts. No formal auditions are given, as participation is one of the major concerns at this age level. The Jr. High jazz band rehearses once a week on Friday from 12:25-12:50. 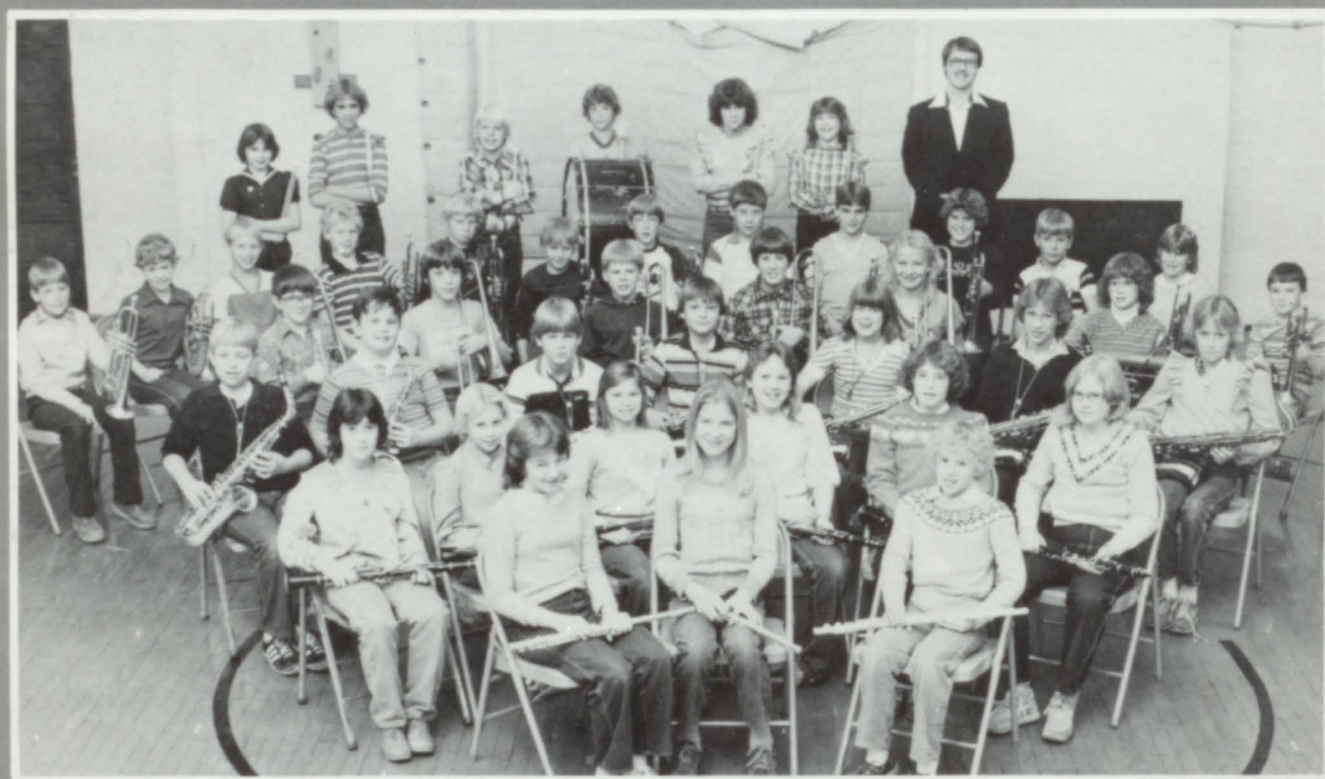

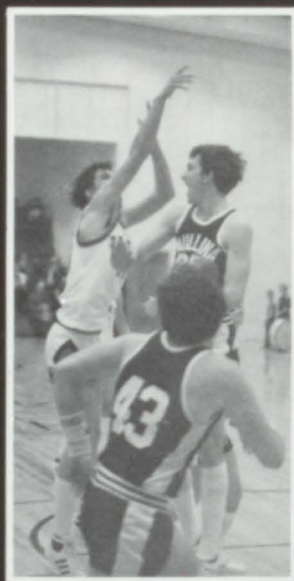


Conference Champs And Sub-State Fighters

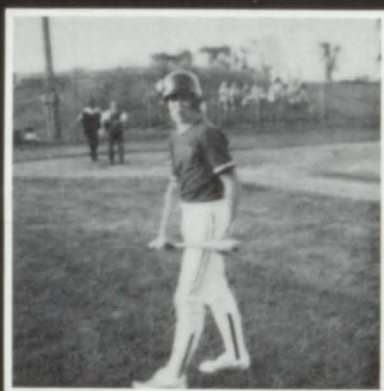
Spooking The Opponents
